

will hold Headstart, Pre-Kindergarten Headstart or Pre-K need not register. and Kindergarten pre-registration from 8:30 a.m. until 1:30 p.m., on Monday and Tuesday, April 19 and 20, 1993. Parents should report to the Plains Elementary School for registration and should bring appropriate documents as listed.

It is not necessary for children to be present at registration, however, if you wish, you and your child may eat lunch with us on the day that you register. If you plan to eat in the cafeteria, please call the office (456-7438) ahead of time so that we may plan the number of meals accordingly. Cost for meals is \$2.50 for adults and \$2.00 for students.

There are certain guidelines which must be met for students to be enrolled in the Headstart or Pre-Kindergarten programs. Any child who will be four years old on or before Sept. 1, 1993, may qualify for Headstart or Pre-K providing all guidelines are met. When registering, please bring child's birth certificate, social security number, immunization record, and proof of family income. Proof of income may be a recent pay check stub, or food stamp eligibility statement.

We must have fifteen qualifying students to be able to offer this program. If you know of a child in our community who might qualify, please pass this information on to the parents.

To enroll in kindergarten a child must be five years old on or before Sept. 1, 1993. Please bring a birth certificate, immunization record, and social security number for each child en-
