## City is awarded \$250,000 grant

Officials at the City of Plains were recently notified that the City has been awarded a grant in the amount of $\$ 250,000$ for sewer treatment facility improvements.

This grant is made available through the Texas Community Development Program. The City was one of six entities in the South Plains Region to be funded. A total of 20 applications were submitted for a share of the $\$ 1,220,825$ allocated for this region.

In 1989, the City was cited by the Texas Water Commission for exceeding the maximum flow rates permitted for the present wastewater treatment facility. These grant funds will be used for improvements to the treatment facility to meet these flow requirements.

Construction for this facility will begin once an amendment to the City's
wastewater permit is obtained. Permit amendments can take anywhere from six to 18 months.

The City will apply for additional community development grants for water storage in the near future.
