## Tech prof gives pros, cons of credit surcharge

A law proposed in Congress that would dd a 5 percent tax on goods purchased sumers to benefit from lower advertised prices, said Richard Peterson, a Texas ech finance professor. The 5 percent increase, or surcharge, would involve credit card purchases and
would affect the cash customer because businesses have been marking up prices or everyone, Peterson said.
He said that although the He said that although the surcharge
seems like a good idea, many people are seems like a good idea, many people ar opposed to a surcharge authorization.
"Banks and credit card companies felt
people who paid extra when they charg-
ed a purchase would discontinue charging and credit sales would go down," he said. Some consumer groups also are it gives merchants an excuse to to raise their prices.
Peterson pointed out that competition holds prices down, however, so the sur-
charge leads to more competition charge leads to more competition for customers. The more competition betfor the consumers, Peterson said. The consumers who would benefit most from the credit surcharge would be
cash customers, he said. Because it is cash customers, he said. Because it is
costly for merchants to provide credit, all customers pay for the credit use.
"The merchant receives a discount, credit card company for services provid ed in clearing the charge slip and collecting from the consumer," he said. "The
cash customer is better off in general, cash customer is better off in general
and it puts pressure on the credit carc companies."
But Peterson said the surcharge is no faultless. The disadvantage of a surcharge is the special regulation allowing
businesses to charge up to 5 percent per purchase in addition to an average $11 / 2$ percent interest per month for credit card payments, which gives creditors a high rate of exchange, he said.
An alternative to the surcharge would
be to charge
everyone by raising the prices of all
goods, Peterson said. That way prices are raised for everyone but the cash customers would pay the extra price like Peterson said that is coid. Peterson said that if Congress im-
plements the surcharge law, he does not think all areas of businesses will add a surcharge for credit purchases, because of the costly changes they would have to make. Restaurants and airline companies are two examples of businesses
that would not use the surcharge, he that wou
said.

been asked and Peter Ueberroth seemingly dashing the possibility that she would be. Comaneci, now 22 and eight years
older than when she scored seven perfect 10s in gymnastics in the 1976 Montreal Games, is a guest of the Olympic Organizing Committee in Los Angeles. Tnat led to speculation that she would be asked to light the
Olympic torch, a dramatic highlight of Saturday's Opening Ceremonies. The possibility holds not only nostalgic but political interest. Her
country, Romania, is the only Warcouncry, Romania, is the only Warsaw Pact nation attending the Games.
Others lined up behind the Soviet Union's boycott.
Meanwhile, the U.S. men's basket-
