NEW VETERANS PENSION LAW IS MADE EFFECTIVE ON JULY 1st

DALLAS — The new veterans pension law approved by Congress and the President during 1959 goes into effect July 1.

The Veterans Administration said that veterans who file claims after June 30, 1960 and veteran's dependents who file claims based on deaths after June 30, 1960 can be paid pension only under this

new law known as Public Law 86-211.

The new law increases both the maximum pension payments and the amount permissible income from other sources and provides a sliding scale of payments based on need. At the same time, it provides for counting part of the wife's income as the veterans and for considering the net worth of the applicant.

The new law also puts pension eligibility requirements for widows and orphans of World War II and Korean Conflict veterans on the same eligibility basis as those of World War I. It eliminates the previous requirement that a veteran of World War II or Korea have a service-connected disability at time of death.

Veterans and their dependents already on the pension rolls are allowed either to remain under the previous law or to elect to come under the new law. Such an election once made may not be revoked.

Pension is paid to veterans who are permanently and totally disabled even though the disabilities have no relation to their military service. Payments to veterans or their dependents for service-connected disabilities are called "compensation" and are not affected by the pension laws.

Under the law becoming operative today, single veterans with annual income not exceeding \$1,800 who are permanently and totally disabled may be paid pension at a monthly rate ranging from \$40 to \$85, depending on the amount of other income they have. Similarly disabled veterans who have dependents can draw from \$45 to \$100 per month, and have a maximum income limitation of \$3,000. To each of these amounts, \$70 will be added if the veteran requires constant aid and attendance.

Widows alone may be paid from \$25 to \$60 a month, and the rate increases from \$40 to \$75-per-month for widows with one child. An extra monthly payment of \$15 is allowed for each additional child. The maximum income limitation for a widow alone is \$1,800 and for a widow with children it is \$3,000.

Under the old pension system veterans, whether single or with dependents, were paid a flat rate of \$66.15. This payment was increased to \$78.75-per-month after 10 years on the rolls or attainment of age 65. Income limitations were \$1,400 a year for single veterans, and 2,700 for veterans with dependents. A payment of \$135.45 was allowed a veteran needing constant aid and attendance.

The old law provided flat payments of \$50.40 for a widow alone; \$63.00 for a widow with one child; and \$75.60 for each additional child.

Judges for the senior division will be Miss Fannie Brown, home demonstration agent of the Texas A&M College Extension Service from College Station; Mrs. Deane Valentine, Erath County home demonstration agent; Mrs. Velma Slaughter, Brown County home demonstration agent; and Miss Kathyleen Slaughter, Comanche County home demonstration agent.

Junior division judges will be Miss Hellon Brazil, Burnet County home demonstration agent; Mrs. Betty Lacy, Lampasas County home demonstration agent; and Miss Jean Meler, Eastland County assistant home demonstration agent.

Miss Joy Johnson, Erath County girl's district 4-H chairman, will preside while the music will be furnished by Miss Laverne Cagle, vice chairman of the district 4-H council of McLennan County.

Tarleton State President E. J. Howell will welcome the group to the campus.

SPC Official Pays Tribute To Dairy Industry In Talk

Accomplishments of America's dairy industry were cited by a Stephenville business executive this week in a salute to National Dairy Month, being observed throughout June.

W. M. Irwin, general manager of the Stephenville Production Credit Association, paid tribute to the industry for its contributions to the nation's economy and health.

"During 1959, cash income from milk products in Texas alone amounted to more than \$125,000,000," Irwin said. "Only cotton, cattle and grain sorghums outranked milk products in this

category."

In addition, the dairy industry maintained a high level of quality in its products, a major factor in sustaining the excellent health enjoyed by the people of Texas and the nation, he declared.

"The Stephenville Production Credit Association is proud to be associated with the dairy industry in this area," Irwin stated. In its last fiscal year, the association provided a total of \$3,000,000 in loans to area dairymen, he explained.

The Stephenville Production Credit Association, owned and operated by farmers, ranchers and dairymen, serves Erath, Eastland, Comanche, Hamilton, Somervell, Hood, Johnson, Parker, Tarrant and Wise Counties. General offices are in Stephenville with field offices operated in Eastland, Comanche, Cleburne, Fort Worth and Decatur.

Officers and directors are R. Cal McCurdy of Decatur, president; James W. Crouch of Burleson, vice president; Irwin, general manager and secretary-treasurer; T. W. Winters of Evant, C. M. McCain of Eastland and Tom Mazurek of Comanche, directors.

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — I understand that there have been some changes in the income limitations for veterans eligible for pension. Will you explain the changes to me, please?

A — Under present law a veteran who has more than 1400-dollars annual income and no dependents cannot qualify for pension. If he is married or has a minor child, his income cannot be more than 2700-dollars. The new pension law, effective July 1, increases the amount of income a veteran can have, and still collect pension. A veteran with no dependents is allowed up to 1800-dollars income, and up to 3000-dollars if he has dependents.

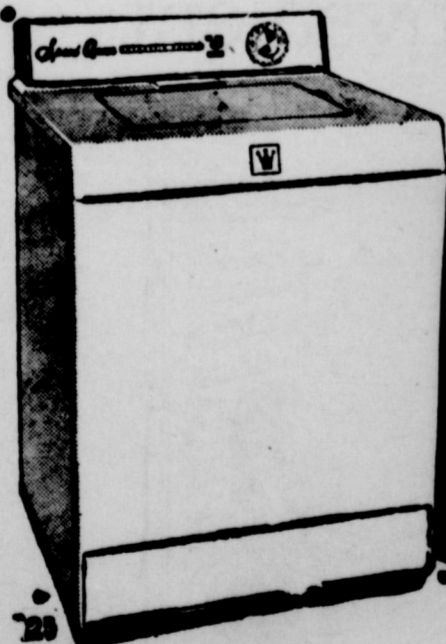

New Law Makes It Illegal For Stock On Roads

AUSTIN — The Texas Department of Public Safety reminded Texas cattle owners today that a new law went into effect July 1 aimed at controlling livestock on designated U.S. and state highways.

The new law makes it illegal for a person knowingly to permit his domestic livestock to roam at large and unattended on state and federal highways. It applies regardless of whether or not the highway right-of-way is fenced. Maximum fine for such violation is \$200, and each day the violation occurs may be considered a separate offense.

Farm to market roads are excepted from the law. The new law also gives law enforcement officers the authority to have such livestock picked up, when unable to locate the owner, and turned over to the sheriff or constable in the county.

The law does not prohibit the driving or herding of livestock across or along highways. It gives peace officers the authority to enforce provisions of the act without a warrant.

Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said state patrolmen will enforce provisions of the law in an effort to reduce the traffic hazard caused by animals on designated state and U.S. highways. He said that during the year 1959 a total of 1406 rural traffic accidents occurred in Texas involving animals of all types. In these accidents 216 persons were injured and 4 persons were killed.
