Pecan Budding School Slated At C of C Office April 25

The third annual Pecan Budding School has been set for Monday, April 25, at the Chamber of Commerce office in Cisco, it was announced Saturday at the county agent's office in Eastland.

The one day school will begin at 9:30 a. m. on that date in the conference room of that organization. The morning session will be devoted to demonstrations and lectures on budding, types and kinds of bud-wood, stock, scion, tying the bud, forcing and the after care of the young buds.

The group attending will go to some nearby native pecan grove after lunch where they will have a chance to practice budding on small pecan trees using the grafting method.

Those interested in having the budding school in Cisco are cordially invited to attend.

**Vets Questions
And Answers**

Q — I need some quick money for an emergency and have been wondering if I should cash in my permanent plan GI life insurance. Before I do this, I'd like some advice from VA. Will you please tell me what would be involved?

A — The VA advises you NOT to cash in your permanent plan GI life insurance. All protection ceases when the policy is surrendered for cash, because, once cancelled, it cannot be restored. You would be much better off to borrow on your insurance. Paid up policyholders may borrow as much as 84 percent of the policy's cash surrender value.

Q — I now receive VA disability pension, under the present law. If I decide to switch to the new system of payment, effective July 1, 1960, will my change be considered final?

A — Yes. If you do decide to move over to the new system, you cannot go back to the old. If you have any doubt about which method of payment is more advantageous to you, the

new or the old, ask your nearest VA office to help you decide.

Q — I am the beneficiary of my veteran-husband's GI insurance policy. He owed a few bills to private individuals at his death, which I intend to pay. Meanwhile, do these creditors have the right to seize the GI insurance policy to get their money right away?

A — No. The proceeds of your husband's GI insurance are exempted by law from any claims of private creditors. The insurance money may not be seized or attached to pay his debts.

Q — I am on VA's pension rolls and must choose whether to come under the new pension program in July or stay with the system under which I am now being paid. Will VA check over my choice for me, to be sure it is in my best interests?

A — Yes. With the pension check VA mails to you around the end of February you will receive an application form and be asked to compute how much you expect to get under the new system, for this year as well as for next year, in case you are thinking of changing. VA will check your computation. If it appears you have made the wrong choice, you will be asked to decide again.

Mistletoe Can

Cause Damage

To Your Trees

Does mistletoe kill trees? For many years people have been asking this question. The latest word from Harlan E. Smith, extension plant pathologist, is that a few mistletoe plants growing on a large healthy tree probably will do little damage.

However, he notes, when these plants become too numerous, they should be removed, especially from valuable ornamental trees. Mistletoe, he explained, is a parasitic flowering plant with small flowers and white berries and is frequently seen growing on limbs of such trees as hackberry, osage, orange, oak, elm and mesquite. It obtains water from the tree upon which it grows and may weaken or even kill the tree, especially when numerous.

It can be rapidly pruned out with a saw or knife or can be broken off with a hook fastened to the end of a pole. Later, new mistletoe sprouts may arise from the point where the original plant was attached and these should likewise be removed. Smith says at present no chemicals are available to use in the control or removal of the parasites.

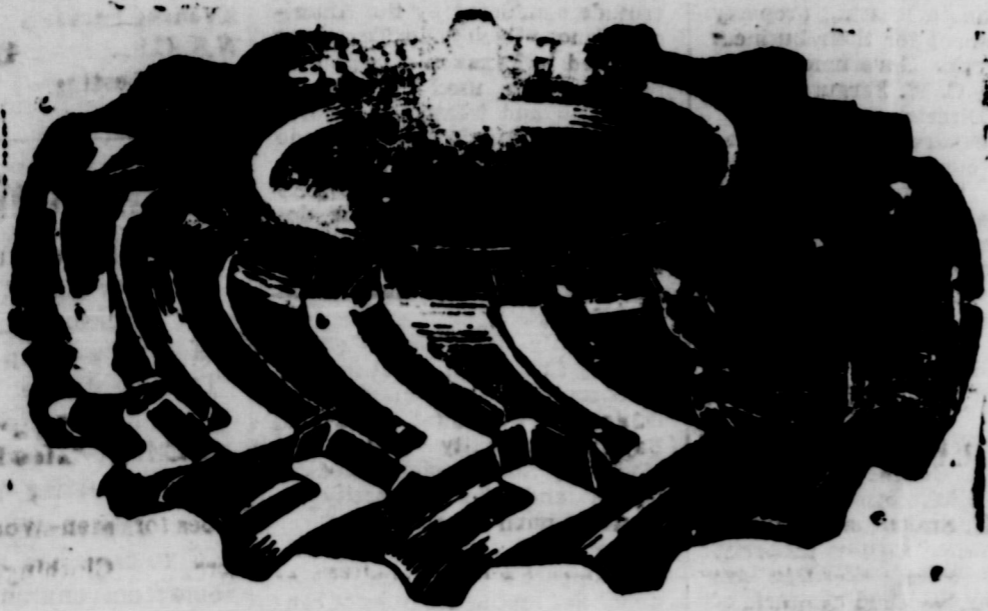

Cancer Society Funds Finance Research Work

Funds collected in the annual April educational fund raising crusade conducted by the American Cancer Society in Texas are returned to Texas in a large proportion to be used in research, education and treatment, according to Mrs. Austin Flint, crusade chairman for Eastland County.

The Texas division of the ACS retains 60c of every dollar donated to the crusade and sends 40c to the national society for its research program, Mrs. Flint brought out.

Currently there are 13 grants totaling \$228,356 in effect in Texas at such research centers as M. D. Anderson Hospital and Clinic, Baylor University College of Medicine, Southwestern Medical School and the University of Texas Medical Branch.

The Texas cancer control dollars support a year round educational life saving program of cancer control as well as conduct vital research activities, Mrs. Flint said.
