Mrs. H. J. Lane, 75, who resided at 306 South Madera St. in Eastland, passed away Friday morning in Eastland Memorial Hospital where she had been seriously ill for several weeks.

Funeral services were held at 3 p. m. Sunday in the Bethel Baptist Church at Eastland with the pastor, Rev. Davis Cooper, and Rev. Harvey Kimbler, pastor of First Baptist Church there and Rev. Roger Butler, pastor of Carbon Baptist Church, conducting the services. Burial was in the Eastland cemetery with Hamner Funeral Home in charge.

Born Mendy Minerva Stapp near Mineola in Wood County on Feb. 4, 1885, Mrs. Lane moved to Stephens County during her childhood. She was married to Hallie J. Lane on Nov. 6, 1901 at Cadde. The Lanes were residents of Carbon for a number of years before moving to Eastland about four years ago.

## Important Peanut Meeting March 14

D. B. Warren, SWPGA director and Glenn Justice, County Farm Bureau president, have announced that an important peanut growers meeting will be held at the Nimrod Community Center March 24, at 7:30 p. m. Mr. Justice stated that the Eastland County Farm Bureau is extremely concerned over the lack of planting allotted peanut acres in the county. His organization is co-sponsoring this meeting.

Several items of vital interest to peanut producers will be discussed. Plans for increasing planted peanut allotment in Eastland County will be one of the featured items. Mr. Emmett Powell, ASC office manager, will explain new peanut acreage allotment provisions. Eastland County has lost hundreds of thousands of dollars the last two years due to the lack of planting allotted peanut acres.

B. C. Langley, supt. of West Cross Timbers Experiment Station, Stephenville, will explain to growers the latest practice relative to the prevention and control of Southern Blight and other plant diseases.

Ross Wilson, SWPGA manager, will answer grower questions relating to the 1960 peanut price support program.

All growers in this area are cordially invited to attend the meeting.

A similar meeting will be held at Gorman school auditorium on March 15 at 7:30 p. m. Refreshments will be served by Gorman businessmen.

## Price Support Of 1960 Peanut Crop Placed At \$201 By USCA

The United States Department of Agriculture has announced that price support on 1960 crop peanuts will be \$201.24 per ton (national average), compared with \$193.50 per ton national average in 1959, according to D. B. Warren, member of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association Board of Directors.

This price is the minimum at which 1960 crop peanuts will be supported on a national basis, he said. It will not be decreased, but may be adjusted upward August 1 at the beginning of the marketing year, for an increased support price is required by legislation at that time.

Mr. Warren explained that the increased support price in 1960 will raise the minimum market price on peanuts sold by farmers since the government support price basically estimates the floor under the market price. The 1960 support figure is therefore \$7 to \$8 per ton more than the 1959 figure, Mr. Warren brought out, or about 12c per bushel more.

A hearing held by the Agriculture Department Feb. 10, 1960,

was mainly responsible for the increase, Mr. Warren stated. Members of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association Board of Directors and grower representatives from the eastern and southwestern states appeared at the hearing and presented evidence of the need for a peanut price increase.

Mr. Warren announced that his organization will again aid the peanut growers of this area in marketing their 1960 crop peanuts.

## Social Security Questions

Q. When should a person inquire about possible benefits from social security?

A. There are FOUR times for action — 1, at retirement age (62 for women, 65 for men); 2, at age 72 if still not retired; 3, soon after becoming severely disabled; and 4, soon after the death of a family member who might be insured under social security laws.

Q. Must I wait until I've reached retirement age to file my claim?

A. No. Your claim may be filed as early as 3 months before the month in which you attain retirement age. Early filing will help make certain that your first check reaches you right on time.

Q. What proofs will I need for a retirement claim?

A. Some evidence as to your age (do not present evidence that is not at least 5 years old, unless that's all you have); some evidence of last year's earnings (form W-2 from your employer, or a copy of your self-employment income tax return if you're self-employed).

Q. How disabled must a person be to qualify for disability benefits?

A. The language in the law requires that a person be so severely disabled that he can no longer engage in substantial gainful activity. Note that the term "permanent" is not used, nor is the term "total."

Q. How soon after becoming disabled can a claim be filed?

A. The law requires that the disability have been in effect for at least six full months before benefits are payable; however, we can accept claims in the fourth month of most disabilities, and complete necessary development in time to prevent delay in issuance of the first benefit check.

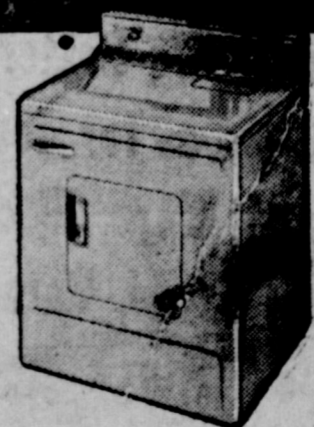

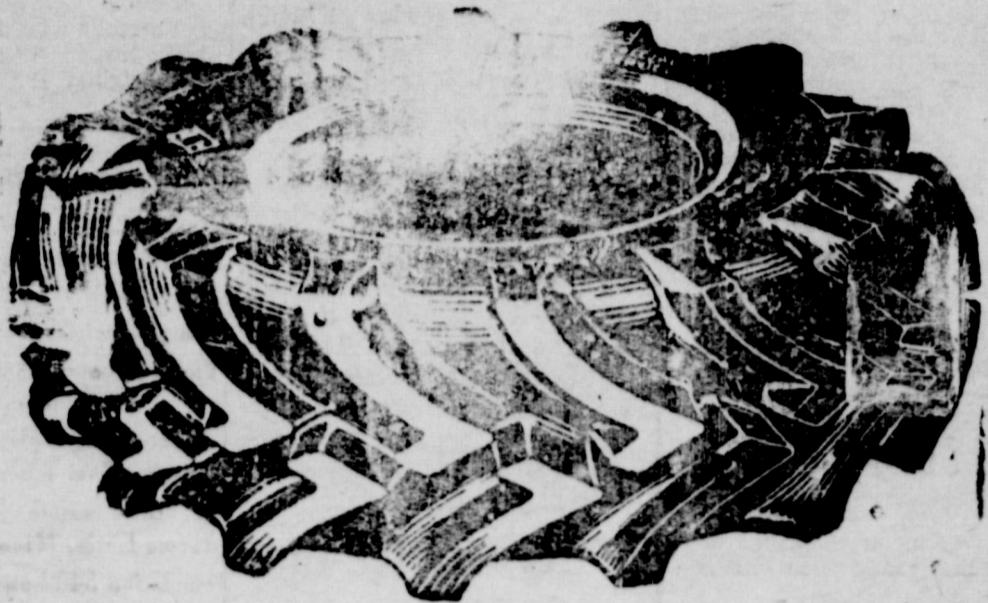

## SECOND LEGAL HITCH DEVELOPS IN COUNTY'S BOUNTY PROGRAM

A second legal hindrance concerning the bounty on predatory animals has been brought to the attention of the Eastland County Commissioners Court Monday by County Attorney Earl Conner. The court recently voted to place a \$10 bounty on wolves, \$5 on bobcats and \$3 on red foxes.

Mr. Conner pointed out that the Court cannot legally pay the \$10 bounty on wolves as they voted to do because of a law passed in 1929 by the Texas Legislature placing a \$5 maximum bounty on wolves in Eastland County and several other counties.

Last week the court was questioned on paying a \$3 bounty for red foxes. It is illegal to pay a bounty for fur-bearing animals, the court discovered, and the fox is regarded as a fur-bearing animal. At the time the Court agreed to hold up action of the bounty for red foxes until the attorney general could rule on the legality of such action.

In a special Court session Monday the Commissioners decided to revert to the former bounty laws of \$5 for wolves and \$3 on bobcats and no bounty for foxes until further action may be taken.

### Confusion Seen By Taxpayers In Community Taxes

The Internal Revenue Service reports that many Texans become confused on the community property law requirements at tax filing time. As many as 5,000 tax audits are expected in the Dallas District alone due to taxpayer confusion on this point.

A. E. Fogle, Jr., Administrative Officer of the Abilene office, explained that many new Texans find it hard to believe that Texas community property law requires them to file their income tax return differently from most other states. He assured these new Texans, as well as the old ones, that the community property law does apply to their income tax. He gave this explanation:

- (1) Texas community property law gives both husband and wife one-half of the total income and withholding credit each one receives.
- (2) This means that in Texas the husband and wife must either file a joint return including all income or split equally between them for tax purposes all the income received by both and each file on one-half.
- (3) If the husband and wife each file a separate return then they must either itemize the total deductions, taking one-half on each return, or both elect to take the standard deduction.
- (4) The wife who works a short period cannot file a claim for refund claiming her exemption and then file a joint return with her husband.
- (5) The husband and wife must split the income if they file separate returns. The husband and wife who file separate returns and do not split the income may cause a long delay in receiving their refund checks. Their returns will probably be audited if they do not follow the community property law in determining their income for the year.

Taxpayers having questions on community property income can call the IRS office for help.
