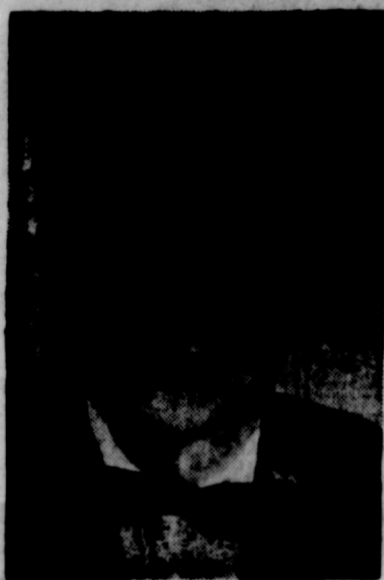

Abilene Attorney Issues Statement In Congress Race

R. M. (Bob) Wagstaff of Abilene has formally announced his candidacy for the office of Congress from the 17th District.

"Effective representation is the issue in this race," declared Wagstaff.

"The present incumbent has been in congress for fourteen years, and has not given this district the character of representation to which it is entitled. A change is long past due."

Wagstaff is a member of the law firm of Wagstaff, Harwell, Alvis & Pope, of Abilene, Texas. It is the oldest and largest law firm in this area. He is widely known as an able and experienced lawyer, and for the important legislation which he sponsored as a member of the Texas House of Representatives. The Wagstaff Ace, preserving the rights of cities, towns, farmers and ranchers to the use of their own waters; and the Oil and Gas Conservation Statutes, regulating the production of oil and gas, are among the most important laws on the statute books of Texas today.

"The time has come for the people to retire these so-called 'Career Congressmen,'" said Wagstaff. "They are apparently unable to solve the problems which confront our nation. It's time for a change!"

"I believe the time has come for this district to send to Washington an experienced lawyer, business man and rancher who is more interested in the larger problems of the day than in Pork Barrel Legislation and the next election.

"In the fiscal year ending June 30, 1959, the Government levied more taxes, spent more money, incurred the greatest national debt, lost more gold, and incurred the greatest deficit ever recorded in time of peace. Nobody knows with certainty how much the Government owes, or is appropriating, because while we are shoveling the money out of the

front door in congressional appropriations, the back doors of the Treasury are wide open and the spenders are carrying it out the back door without the let or hindrance of annual congressional appropriations check or justification.

"National defense is in an uncertain state, and it is certain that we are behind the enemy in the missile race. The national debt increases by billions, and no real attempt is being made to balance the budget. An unbalanced budget causes the cost of living to increase each month, and higher and higher taxes take an increasing amount of the individual's income each year. Interest rates on government bonds are the highest in many years. The farm problem is unsolved, the farmers' income is the lowest in fifteen years, and burdensome surpluses overhang the market and strain the resources of the Government to pay storage charges. Old Age Assistance has been neglected, and money which might have been used to raise old age pensions to an adequate level has been squandered recklessly. The Social Security system is not actually sound, and faces a crisis during the next few years. The oil industry faces serious problems, and lacks effective leadership in Congress. The Federal Government continues to intrude into the affairs of the states. The only remedy the people have is to retire enough 'Career Congressmen' to bring about a change. You will have an opportunity to express yourselves on May 7th.

"I have made arrangements, upon taking my seat in Congress, to resign completely from the practice of law and to devote my entire time to the interest of the people of this district. 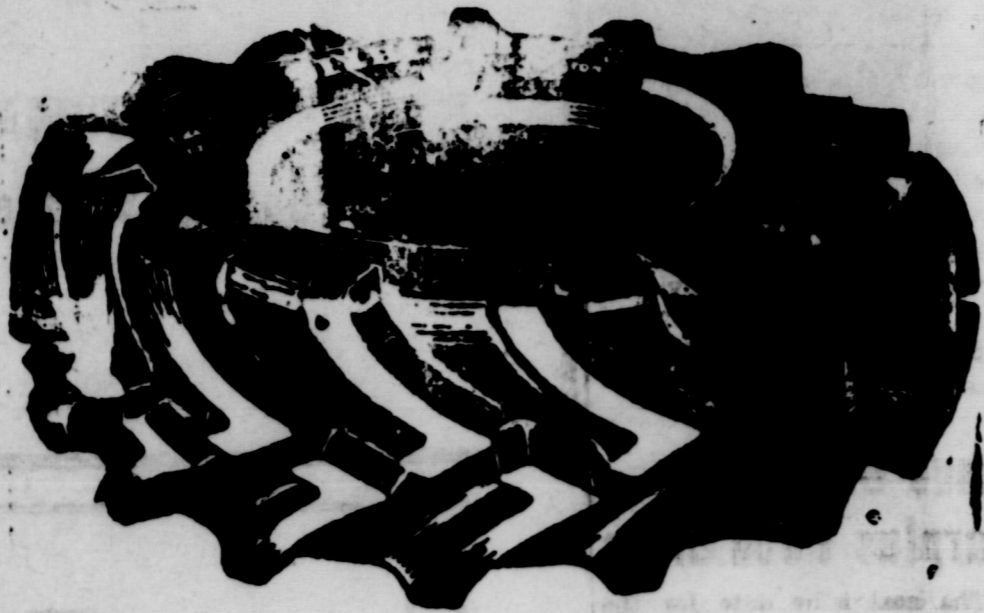



How To Have Spring In Your Lawn

Dreaming about having a beautiful carpet of green around your home this spring? You can know. Good grass seed, careful soil preparation, and seeding in early spring will turn your dream into reality. It is important to get an early start because grasses grow best in cool weather. Success also depends upon deep cultivation of the soil prior to seeding, because roots reach down in search of moisture and nutrients all summer long.

It pays to prepare the soil as well as you possibly can, for enriched with fertilizer and reinforced with water-holding peat moss, your soil will maintain a green lawn for years and years.

As a general recommendation, gardening experts suggest 4 pounds of an all purpose fertilizer, such as 9-15-9 or 8-16-8 and at least 2 bushels of peat moss per 100 square feet. Ground limestone at 3 to 5 pounds per 100 square feet is necessary if the existing soil is known to be on the acid side.

Don't despair if you have a heavy clay soil. You can still have that green carpet, for soil conditioners worked into the soil along with the fertilizer and peat moss improve its natural quality. Great quantities of peat moss are the answer for very sandy soils which naturally have no water holding capacity.

Aside from thorough soil preparation, it is important that you obtain quality seed. Seed mixtures are prepared by specialists. Some are designed for sunny and others for shaded areas. Some are especially useful in hot, dry climates and others are recommended to withstand heavy traffic. The list of ingredients of the seed is given on the seed bag or package.

The major permanent grasses are bluegrass, fescue and bent, and the higher percentage of these varieties in the mixture you purchase, the better. They make permanent lawns that last and are well worth their cost.

Whether you seed a new lawn early this spring or plan to mend an old one by fertilizing and seeding bare places, a perfect lawn can be yours.
