Billy Charles Caraway won a red ribbon on his toms and hens. His premium money was \$9.32 and they sold at auction for

Larry Campbell showed both toms and hens winning a blue ribbon on his hens and a white ribbon on his toms. His turkeys auctioned for \$52.41.

The following boys showed three hens each: Kurt Clark won a red ribbon and \$3.82 premium money. His turkeys auctioned

for \$16.80. Roger Woodall won a white ribbon, premium money was \$1.91 and his turkeys auctioned for \$15.17. Ray Woodali won a white ribbon, winning \$1.91 premium money and \$14.80 auction money.

Jack Callaway won a red ribbon, \$3.82 premium money and \$17.22 auction money. Curtis L. Boase, Assistant County agent, was in charge of the group.

The turkeys were given to the boys in March of this year by the Kincaid Hatchery in Eastland for the best essays on "Why Turkey Growing is Important in Eastland County," according to Boase.

PREPARING THE FLUFFY
WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup
of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold
water and 1 teaspoon of salt into

a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as lew as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while is is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately. For real convenience and econusy of time and effert, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by sealding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.



Information On Soil Bank Money Released By SS

Many farm operators have been sending inquiries to the Social Security Administration in Abilene during the past few months, checking on whether soil bank payments count for social security purposes, it was reported by the Abilene office. To supply the farm operators with the necessary information, R. R. Tuley, Jr., District Manager of the Abilene office, has released the following paragraphs:

"All types of soil bank payments are considered as income for social security purposes except part of the conservation reserve reimbursement payments. These are payments made by the Federal Government to pay part of the cost of carrying out the conservation practices and making improvements on the conservation reserve. Even these payments are includable if the expenditures are deductible as business expenses for income tax purposes.

"A farm owner who receives rental income, but he takes no part in the actual operation of the farm, cannot count either the soil bank payments or other rental income for social security purposes. Farm and ranch operators past the age of 65 should make every effort to contact a representative of the Social Security Administration before January 1, 1957, as there are some instances where the filing of a claim before that date can result in a higher benefit amount.

"The amount of any monthly benefits under the old-age and survivors insurance provisions of the Social Security Act is based on the insured individuals average monthly earnings. The minimum monthly payments to the insured individual is \$30 and the maximum is \$108.50 per month."
