History Of The 1938 Study Club

Editors Note—The '38 Study Club, a woman's club organized, of course, in 1938 which was active until May of 1956, has disbanded because of lack of members. Because this club and its activities was of interest to many of our readers, we asked Mrs. Stubblefield and Mrs. Hines, first and last presidents respectively, to give us a brief history of this club which we are printing herewith. Due to the length of the article and our lack of space, we are printing it in installments which will take 2 or perhaps 3 weeks to conclude.

The article follows:

On August 24, 1938, the '38 Study Club of Carbon was organized by Mrs. C. G. Stubblefield in her home. She foresaw the need of a literary club at Carbon and invited all women who were interested in better community spirit to come to her home and help organize into a loyal, cooperative Study Club. She called Mrs. M. H. Hagaman of Ranger, president of the District Texas Federated Woman's Clubs, to come and help form the organization. The gratifying number of 20 was present. Unity was established, the organization took form. Officers chosen were pres; Mrs. C. G. Stubblefield, vice pres; Mrs. H. D. Thomason, sec.; Mrs. F. J. Stubblefield, treas.; Mrs. D. L. Adair.

On August 31, a club luncheon was held at Mrs. Stubblefield's with Mrs. W. A. Martin, Eastland, president of County Federation, as special guest and 16 charter members present. With enthusiasm, plans were made and the club was off to an excellent start. All committees, including Constitution and By-laws, were appointed. They decided the new club would be The '38 Study Club. The first roster included 16 charter members: Mmes. D. L. Adair, A. M. Claborn, A. A. Davis, Ira Ford, W. J. Greer, Harry Hall, Henry Hines, T. G. Jackson, Sr., T. G. Jackson, Jr., Bonnie Poe, Jake R. yne, Clara Smith, Overton Stone, F. J. Stubblefield, C. G. Stubblefield, H. D. Thomason and L. S. Williams.

The preamble to the constitution read:

Weather Bureau Instruments Are Installed At Lake Cisco

The U. S. Weather Bureau has installed three instruments at Lake Cisco Courts to record weather information for this area, according to City Secretary Hal Lavery. Mrs. Ray Judia will serve as record keeper for the instruments, which include a pressure microbarograph, a recording rain gauge and a hydrothermograph for recording temperature and humidity.

H. T. Paukert, field representative for the U. S. Weather Bureau center at Fort Worth, was here Wednesday to install the equipment.

Cisco was chosen as one of 170 stations in a new network of the storm research program of the weather bureau, Mr. Lavery said. Other instruments, including a wind gauge, are expected to be installed here at a later date.

Preliminary work in the storm research field has indicated that a sudden barometric pressure change in a line of roughly 75 to 100 miles in length and traveling at 30 to 35 miles per hour can definitely be associated with severe storm occurrences such as tornadoes. This phenomena has been called a "pressure jump line," and the Bureau proposes to investigate the conditions immediately ahead of and behind these lines in the greatest detail in order to bring about a clearer understanding of the terrifying and destructive forces of tornadoes and other storms which may be associated with the phenomena. If the pressure jump program fulfills expectations, it should prove a valuable ally to radar in severe storm forecasting.

Information here will be channeled to the Fort Worth Regional Office of the Weather Bureau for examination and local use and sent on to Washington, D. C., for scientific analysis. The success of the program will depend to a great extent on the endeavors of the cooperative weather observers who give much of their time and effort without personal recognition, the official said.

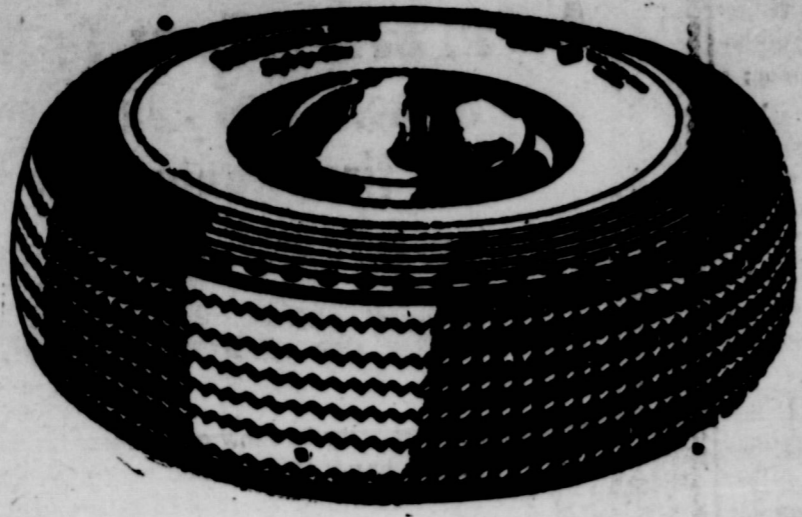
