The emergency feed grain program is now authorized in 185 counties in Texas, Mr. McKay advised.

Walter T. McKay, state director, Farmers Home Administration, has advised Homer P. Cole, FHA County Supervisor, of the designation of Eastland County under the Hay and Roughage program for Texas.

Applications to participate in the Hay and Roughage program will be received by county Farmers Home Administration committee immediately at the Farmers Home Administration office located at Eastland.

The Hay and Roughage program was worked out between the Governor and the Secretary of Agriculture to provide emergency assistance to farmers and ranchers in the State's designated disaster counties. Under the program the local county FHA committee will determine each applicant's eligibility and will issue a certificate good for \$7.50 per ton on roughage actually purchased. The applicant will then apply the certificate on the purchase price of roughage from any dealer he chooses. The dealer endorses the certificate and draws a draft on the Emergency Drought Committee's account.

Applications may be filled through December 3, 1956, for a supply of roughage needed to last through December 31, 1956. Roughage under the program includes hay either baled or loose, cotton seed hulls, peanut hulls, corn cobs, sorghum bundles or ensilage.

## PLANS ARE DISCUSSED TO HOLD MENTAL HEALTH CLINIC SOON

Plans for a Mental Health Clinic for the evening, August 16, in Carbon, Texas, Electric Conference Room, Eastland. The clinic, one of three to be sponsored by District I of the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers, will be held in the Ranger Recreational Building, Thursday, September 27.

The workshops will be based on the booklet, "Mental Health for Effective Living", published by the Hogg Foundation for Mental Hygiene. The booklet contains the materials used by the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs in their studies of mental health.

Mrs. Harry Rudloff, Fort Worth, president of District I of the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers, will preside over the business sessions, and Mrs. James Leonard, also of Fort Worth, will serve as a consultant for the workshops. Mrs. Leonard is the state chairman of Mental Health of the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers.

The president of the Eastland County Council of the Parent Teacher Association, Mrs. M. W. Herweck, appointed the following persons to serve on the work-

shop committee: G. E. Gore, Jr., Ranger; Mrs. W. L. Darr, Cisco; and Mrs. Kennedy, Ranger.

In a release by Betty Moore, administrative secretary of the Hogg Foundation for Mental Hygiene, it was pointed out that mental health is a desirable way of thinking in an individual, family, or a community, which is acquired and maintained either consciously or unconsciously and which results in a desirable way of living. Mental health should never be confused with mental illness, but is a desirable factor in individual, family, or community life.

A mentally healthy person gets along with himself and others, is relaxed, meets problems with confidence, and grows steadily toward maturity, it was pointed out. The mentally healthy family works, plays, prays, stays, and grows together. A community working toward mental health provides the best in government, educational facilities, health services, recreation, counseling and guidance, child placement, welfare, job opportunity, care of the aged.

**Vets' Survivors Given Suggestions On Seeking Help**

Four suggestions to aid survivors of deceased veterans residing in the 51 North Texas Counties served by the Dallas VA Regional Office in filing claims for death compensation and pension were offered today by Mr. Scott B. Harrington, manager of that office.

The Dallas VA Regional Office now processes new claims for death benefits under a recent VA decentralization program. Formerly, these claims had to be sent to Denver, Colorado for processing.

By following these four suggestions survivors will expedite the payment or rejection of claims, Mr. Harrington said. The hints are:  
 1. If the veteran's death certificate does not contain a statement as to the cause of death, it should be accompanied by a certificate from the attending physician showing the dates of treatment and cause of death.  
 2. A widow filing a claim should furnish the record of her marriage to the veteran. If she or the veteran were previously married, she should furnish copies of death or divorce certificates to establish that previous marriages were dissolved.  
 3. If minor children are among the survivors, birth or baptismal records are required, containing the names of both parents and date of birth. If the children were adopted, a copy of the court order of adoption is needed.  
 4. Parents filing a claim must establish their relationship to the veteran by furnishing VA with a certified copy of the veteran's birth or baptismal certificate containing the names of both parents and evidence to show dependency.

Mr. Harrington said this evidence is required by the laws governing compensation and pension payments.

**Rio Grande River  
Is No Barrier To  
Flies Of Mexico**

AUSTIN, Aug. 14. — In case there are really serious doubts about it, an international team of fly specialists has proved conclusively that flies don't give a fig about immigration restrictions along the U. S. Mexico border.

The question as to how readily Mexican and Texas flies migrate has been unanswered for a long time. Do they brave the perils of crossing the Rio Grande in numbers? Or, do just a few of the sturdier ones dare the trip in favor of better pickings on the other side?

Or do Mexican flies stay in Mexico, while Texas flies stick to this side of the river?

The answer is important because of the tremendous disease spreading potential a single fly represents.

Last week the answer was made crystal clear. They cross, in numbers, any time the notion strikes them.

The proof came through the combined efforts of health workers from the U. S. Public Health Service, the State Department of Health, and local departments in Laredo and Nuevo Laredo.

The Laredo-Webb County

Health Department's interest in the subject is obvious: the city has suffered 27,200 cases of dysentery and 116 deaths since 1947. During the average year the border city reports 5,000 cases and some 25 deaths from the enteric disease.

Proof of fly immigrations came about like this:

Some 25,000 flies were captured from two hog feeding installations in Laredo, and an additional 30,000 from a couple of dairies in Nuevo Laredo. Texas flies were dyed red and Mexican flies green to mark their point of origin.

Meanwhile, 26 baited traps were scattered around in Nuevo Laredo, and 24 in Laredo.

That evening between 7:30 and 10 o'clock, the flies were released — half from four points on the Texas side of the border and half from sites in Mexico.

During the following two days, flies which had been released in Mexico were recaptured in three traps in Texas. Their tattle-tale green coloring gave them away.

Texas flies were recovered from five traps in Nuevo Laredo. One recovery site on each side was over a mile from the border.

"It proves," said the team leader, "that fly control programs on one side are practically useless unless the other side undertakes simultaneous programs."
