Record Crop Seen For County Pecan Growers In 1956

A record pecan crop is in prospect for Eastland County, according to County Agent J. M. Cooper, who reports that he has never seen a bigger crop of pecans set on the trees at this time of the

In spite of heavy freezes and hails which inflicted damage to the county peach crop, Mr. Cooper stated that growers over the county would make a one-third peach crop generally, and that some will make a one-half crop or better.

Other fruit, such as pears and apples, also will yield fair crops according to the present growing indications.

With adequate moisture for planting in most parts of the county, the general agriculture outlook is better than it has been in a number of years. The southern part of the county has benefited most from the recent rains, and if the rains continue through

Individual low bids were accepted on two pieces of road machinery at the Monday meeting of the Eastland County Commissioners Court. Total cost of the new road maintenance equipment which the commissioners voted to pay is \$21,007.

A low bid of \$9507 on a 11/2 yard front-end Caterpillar Traxcavator was made by the General Texas Machine Co., and a Model HD516 track machine was purchased from Shaw Equipment Co. for \$11,509 with a trade-in allowance for an old machine. The Traxcavator will be used in Precinct 2 and the track machine is for use in Precinct 3. Both will be paid for with monies from the road and bridge fund of the two precincts. Sealed bids on the two machines were received from both companies.

A request by County Clerk Johnson Smith for a microfilm machine was refused because of lack of funds, according to a statement made by the commissioners. Smith had asked for the machine so that permanent copies could be made of all existing birth certificates and other county records. His request stated that the cost of the machine was \$550, while the cost of making the records permanent by present means would be several thousand dollars. The commissioners agreed to consider the machine's purchase at a later time.

The recommendations of the 91st Court grand jury that an air conditioner be purchased for the jail living quarters was considered at the Monday meeting, but action was postponed pending further investigation.

Repairs and improvements to a county road for which the court has secured a new right-of-way will necessitate the moving of a Sinclair oil line which runs under the pavement. The oil company has asked that the county pay for laying of their lines under the new right-of-way, but the Commissioners Court voted not to

the summer, the outlook for peanut and feed crops is excellent, Mr. Cooper said.

Pastures are in poor condition in Eastland County where the grass cover has been lost because of lack of rain and overgrazing. This exists in the tight land areas, and in the sandy land areas, the range is reported to be in fair condition.

Mr. Cooper also reported that most of the major pecan growers in the county have sprayed their orchards against the pecan nut case bearer in the past week which will insure a better quality

VA Cautions Vets About Home Loans

Veterans should not misunderstand a commonly used statement that Veterans Administration "approves" houses to be financed under the GI loan program, VA cautioned today.

VA said use of the word "approves" causes some veterans to believe the home is "approved or guaranteed" by VA.

VA has only the legal authority to appraise the house to make sure the price the veteran pays is not excessive in the housing market prevailing at the time the appraisal is made.

VA makes available an inspection service in most cases on proposed new homes to determine whether they meet accepted stan-dards of good construction and whether they conform to plans and specifications on which VA's appraisal is based.

The terms "VA or GI financing" are allowed by VA, but the agency frowns on "GI or VA approved" since it gives veterans an erroneous impression.
