### New Plan Is Worked Out For Storms

In an effort to eliminate much of the confusion which follows a storm warning announcement, the recently organized West Texas Weather Warning and Oeservation Service is seeking to set up an effective civil defense and oisaster organization to serve all West Texas communities, it was reported here today.

At an instruction meeting held at the West Texas Utilities Lytle Lake Auditorium near Abilene on Monday, Department of Pubic Safety and U. S. Weather Bureau officials explained to area epresentatives the steps in advising people what to do when tornado is sighted, as well as how to organize the observer

Ciscoans attending the meeting were: H. L. Ferguson of West Texas Utilities Co., Pete Clements of Lone Star Gas Co., Tommy Wilson and Lee Horn of the Cisco police force. Ferguson and Clements represented the local

fire department. In future weather reporting, the term "alert" will not be used, the Cisco men were told. Conditions indicating a possible tornado will be reported as a "severe weather forecast" until the tornado is actually sighted by a civil defense observer. It will be important that all communities cooperate to trace the complete path of the storm and to give eye-witness accounts to the weather bureau radio dispatcher, Ferguson and


