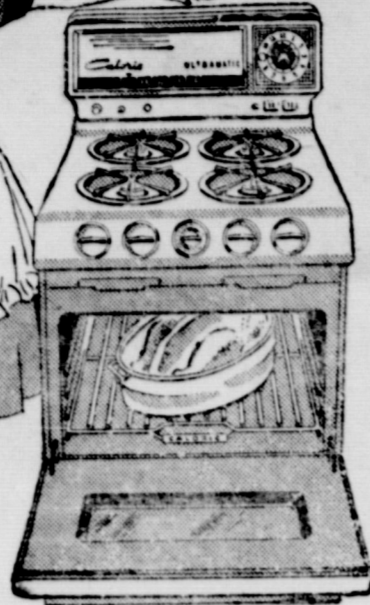

COUNTY PECAN GROWERS TAKE MANY HONORS AT STATE SHOW

Eastland County pecan growers again won their share of honors with their nuts at the State Pecan Show held at A&M College recently, according to word at County Agent J. M. Cooper's office.

The growers received 24 places out of a possible 51 to cop nearly 50% of the entire show. The winning nuts at the county show at Cisco last December were entered in the state show. This has been the practice for the past few years.

B. B. Freeman, pecan grower and nurseryman, Rt. 1, Ranger, was the leading winner of the Eastland County delegation with eight ribbons to add to his collection. He won first on both his Burketts and Western Schley entries. He got second on his Mahan, San Saba Improved and second on the heaviest pecans in the show, which incidentally was the Mahan entry which weighed out 29.9 nuts to the pound. He also won second on his Stuarts and the Success-Burkett cross and third on the nuts with the best kernel.

Ellis Cooper, Ranger, got second place with his entry of Western Schley nuts.

Bess Alexander, Pioneer, won first on his Halbert and third on his Western Schley.

The Carbon winner was Mrs. A. C. Underwood with first on her Onliwon and second on her Halbert pecans.

All three places for the heaviest seedlings were from the county with B. M. Bennett, Gorman, first; H. Capers, Gorman, second and N. B. Eaves, Carbon, third. Eaves also won third on the seedling nuts with the highest percent kernel.

Wayne Thurman, Cisco, got second on his nuts with the highest percent kernel, second on his entry with the best kernel, third on his Eastern Schley and third on the San Saba Improved variety.

Guy Parker, Eastland, with his seedling entry, got second on the best shelling nut and second on one with the highest percent kernel for seedlings.

Martha Wende, Cisco, got first place on the nuts with the best kernels with her Eastern Schley entry.

Pecan growers at their annual spring field day will determine where the county show will be held in December. The county show for the past three years has been held in Cisco in December.

Grass Project Will Be Held On March 8

All farmers and ranchers who are interested in grass developments and who feel a need for help in their development programs were invited to attend a field day tour of the B. B. Hickman ranch four miles west of Rising Star on March 8.

Hickman, who is chairman of the board of supervisors of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District, has announced that the problem of developing Cross Timbers brushland into high producing grassland on a profitable basis will be discussed on the tour. Practical application of development procedures will also be stressed.

Sale of Auto Plates Lags Behind Last Year

Car owners of Eastland County were reminded that March 31 is the deadline for purchase of 1956 license plates. According to the county tax collector's office, sales are lagging far behind last year's total at this date. Passenger car, commercial, farm and trailer licenses may all be bought at the license sub-station at the Chamber of Commerce office in Cisco, or at the county office at the court house in Eastland.

To avoid delay, license purchasers should bring with them both last year's receipt and the certificate of title to the vehicle for which the licenses are being bought. It is necessary to have these two papers before the new licenses will be issued.

Drought Feed Is Still Available

Walter T. McKay, state director of Farmers Home Administration has announced that FHA for drought feed aid through County Committees are being authorized to accept applications.

This applies to all presently designated counties, McKay stated, and represents an extension of the program where it is now in effect in 87 Texas Counties.

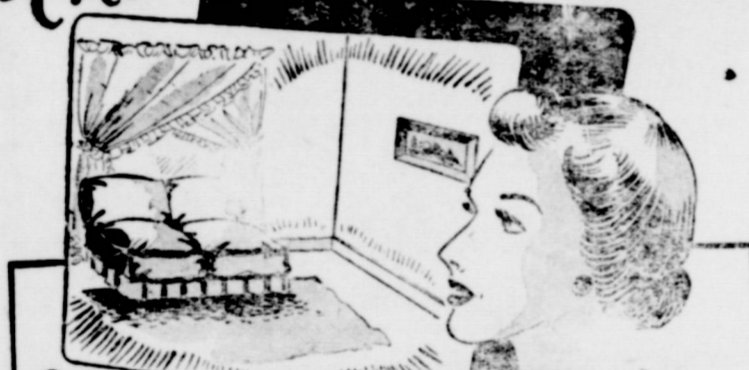
