Retail sales in 1954 of 376 stores in Eastland County totaled \$22,-547,000, according to preliminary 1954 Census of Business figures announced by the Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. This was a decrease of 0.1 percent under sales in 1948 of 428 stores at \$22,567,000.

Stores with payroll in 1954 numbered 232, had 857 paid employees in November 1954, reported payroll of \$1,682,00, and accounted for sales of \$20,253,000. Proprietors of unincorporated businesses number 396.

Self Employment Cax Should Be aid By Farmers

Thousands of farmers have not aid their 1955 self-employment ax in filing their 1955 income tax eturn, according to Ellis Campbell, Jr., district director of the Dallas district of Internal Reve-

ue Service. Farmers became subject to payng the self-employment tax durg 1955 for the first time. Mr. ampbell stated that it appears at many farmers feel that selfmeloyment tax coverage is op-

onal for farmers. This is not we. Under the provisions of the ew self-employment tax law, the rmers became subject to this x on the same mandatory basis nat they are subject to income

Farmers should carefully reiew the self-employment tax inructions before filing their tax tarns. These instructions rere careful study before the rmer can determine whether he is subject to self-employment tax and, of course, whether he will eventually be eligible for Social Security benefits under the law, Mr. Campbell said.

Social Security Checks May Be Due Many Here

A good-sized number of the people who read this newspaper could get Social Security checks by applying for them, but don't know of their eligibility, according to R. R. Tuley, Jr., Abilene district manager for Social Security.

Tuley explained that these peo-

ple are eligible:

1. Insured persons between 65 and 72 earning \$1200 or less in a year can draw their full benefits. They can get some checks even if their earnings are as high as \$2080 in a year. Income from investments, rentals, interest, etc., do not count as "earnings." The word "Insured" means having credit for a certain amount of Social Security work. Those 65 before July 1, 1956 are insured

with as little as 11/2 years work. Those just now reaching age 65 need two years of Social Security credits.

2. Anyone now 72 or over who has as much as 11/2 years work covered by Social Security can get full benefits regardless of present earnings.

3. There is a special rule for survivors of persons who died between 1940 and September 1, 1950. If any such person had as much as 1½ years of social security credits at the time of his death, benefits may now be paid to his widow at age 65, or to any unmarried children still under the age of 18.

Tuley urged anyone who thinks he or she may qualify under one of the above provisions to get in touch with his office promptly. He emphasized that no Social Security benefits can be paid until a claims application has been filed and that he has no means of identifying and notifying all those who may be eligible.

Children Cautioned Of Flying Hites

Safety rules for boys and girls who fly kites were outlined by L. D. Stewart, manager for Texas Electric Service Company, in anticipation of the opening of the 1956 kite flying season.

As explained by Mr. Stewart. the five safety rules in order of their importance are: 1, fly your kite out in the open where it won' get caught in wires or trees. 2 use only strings made of cotton rilk, linen, nylon or rayon. 3, use only wood in your kite frames. 4 fly kites only in good weather. You don't want to get them raid scaked. 5, if your kite should get caught in electric wires, call Texas Electric Service Co. They will send someone to get it for you.

"Local youngsters have been very careful in the past about when and where they flew their kites" Stewart said. "We had a perfect record last year with not one boy or girl being injured and only a few kites demolished. This year, I fu'ly expect that even the number of kites lost will be rel duced because it seems that every year, our boys and girls listen more careful y to our warpings and cooperate better in making kite flying s fe."
