Terrace System

According to reports of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation service, scientists say that it takes nature around 200 years to make one inch of top soil and that without proper protection on the land, several inches of rich top soil can be lost in just a few heavy rains.

Terraces are the basic mechanical means of protecting croplands. The supervisors of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District and the Eastland County ASC committee recognize the need for and recommend the construction of terraces. Federal cost share for terraces construc-

Orchard specialists who have been engaged as guest speakers for the Eastland County Orchard Field Day slated for Feb. 23 at the J. E. Spencer orchard were announced this week by J. M. Cooper, county agent.

The day's program will include discussions and demonstrations led by T. E. Denman, Agricultural Experiment Station, Stephenville, Texas; B. G. Hancock and George R. Williams of the Texas A&M College Extension Service; U. A. Randolph, Agricultral Experiment Station, Montague; and J. W. Foster, Jr. of Weatherford, Marketing, varieties of peaches, fertilizers, grape production, pruning, fertilization and control of insects and diseases are topics to

be discussed and demonstrated. The all-day meeting will begin at 10 a. m. and will be concluded at 4 p. m. Those attending should bring a picnic lunch, and free coffee and drinks will be furnished.

conservation statistics state that the shortening of the slope and slow movement of water will help during years of short rainfall, by acting as a barrier and holding small showers on the land long enough for most of the water to be absorbed by the soil; therefore, making better use of rainfall even during dry years.

Data from the conservation committee also says that terraces are an important asset in the control and prevention of gulley erosion by breaking up the concentration of runoff water and safely emptying it onto a stable grass outlet. This, in most cases, would be onto native pasture land or, into a well-established grass



The information concerning the building of terraces also says that the terraces help in still another way by encouraging contour farming. Farming with the terraces places each row more on the level and aids in the holding of excess water on the soil for a longer period of time according to the report. Thus, contour cultivation slows down the movement of water which aids in erosion control and gives the soil a chance to absorb more of the rainfall, concludes the conservation report.

Farmers interested in assistance for terrace construction were asked to contact the local Soil Conservation Service office and the Agricultural Stabilization office.

Bulk Of Farm Loans Used For Equipment, Livestock

Approximately \$5,130,000, or 48 percent of the production and subsistence loans obtained by farmers in Texas from the Farmers in Texas from the Farmers Home Administration during the past year, were used to purchase equipment, livestock and make similar investments, Homer P. Cole, County Supervisor for the agency, said Saturday.

Farmers are making these investments to set up the kind of farming systems that will make he most of their labor, land and ther resources, he said.

Production and substence loans are also made for fertilizer, seed, tractor fuel, insecticides and other farm and home operating expenses. The loans bear 5 percent interest and repayments are scheduled in accordance with the borrower's almity to repay. Loans for crop production are repayable when income from the crop is received. Loans for capital investments are repayable over periods up to 7 years. The maximum loan is \$7,000 and total indebtedness cannot exceed \$10,000.

Several steps are taken by the Farmers Home Administration to assist farmers in making the best use of their loan funds. Before a loan is made a complete form plan is prepared by the farm family with the assistance of the agency's local supervisor. The plan shows how the farm will be operated, estimated yields and income, and a budget for farm and home expenses. Provision is made for the production of a large portion of the family's food supply and provision is made in the budget for household expenditures and medical care.

No loan is made unless the farm and home plan shows that the farm when properly operated under normal conditions will produce an income that will provide the family a good living and enable them to repay their debts.

Guides have been established with the aid of the Extension Service and other agricultural agencies that show desirable combinations of enterprises, the amount of land, quanity of livestock, amount and quality of pasture, and feed, acres of cash crops, and the yield per acre and production per animal that are needed for the successful operation of family-type farms in each given area. These guides are used in developing the farm and home plans.

In addition, at the end of the crop year a complete review of the year's operations is made by the farm family and the Farmers Home Administration supervisor to determine which farm enterprises were the most successful and what further improvements are to be made in the coming

year.

Credit is also extended by Farmers Home Administration for. financing annual operating expenses. These loans are shortterm credit designed to help formers finance one year's operations. Annual production and subsistance loans may be made to farmers provided there is a sound basis for credit. This means that the anticipated gross income from farming and other sources must be sufficient to repay the loan, meet farm and home expense not provided for in the loan and provide a reasonable margin above such amounts. This type credit is in addition to emergency loans available to farmers or ranchers primarily en-

gaged in farming, Cole stated. Real estate credit for purchase and development of family-type farms, for financing soil conservation measures, and for the development of water systems for farm livestock and irregation are also available.
