

PREPARING THE FLUFFY
WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice; put cup uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt is a two-quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring the heat as low as possible—leave over this low heat for 1 minutes. Turn off the heat. This cooking time results in firm grains of cooked rice. Over a low heat, melt butter, stir in flour and blend thoroughly. Allow to cook 4 or 5 minutes, stirring constantly to prevent browning. Add salt and pepper. Gradually add milk. Continue stirring and cook until mixture.
