Growers from adjoining counties are eligible to enter nuts in the third annual Eastland County Pecan Show at Cisco, December 9 and 10, it was recently announced at the county agent's office. The show held in the Reynolds

building in Cisco and will again be sponsored by the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, according to Paul Brashear, manager, who is actively assisting in arranging for the show.

Growers from Comanche, Brown and Stephens Counties had entries in 1954.

Each entry must constitute enough nuts to weigh at least a pound. All first place entries in the show will have their pecans entered in the state show at A. & M. College.

Entries may be left at either the Cisco Chamber of Commerce office or at the county agent's office in Eastland.

Cash premiums and ribbons will be awarded the winners.

Varieties of nuts may be native or improved pecans such as Burkett, Mahan, Stuart, Texas Prolific, Western Schley, John Garner, Halbert, San Saba and others. The Freeman Pecan Nursery, Ranger, will give a budded tree to the winners of the Burkett, Western Schley and Mahan varieties.

A Bake Show featuring pecan pies, cakes, candies and cookies will also be held in connection with the show.

The County Pecan Show for the past two years has been the only one of its kind in Texas.

Toasted Rice Turkey Stuffing

This stuffing is a "must" for that turkey you're roasting. Toasted grains of rice have a delicious nutty flavor that's just right with turkey. This stuffing is so good and easy to make, you'll use it with chicken, too.

Roast Turkey with TOASTED RICE STUFFING Giblet Gravy Sweet Potato Casserole Buttered Broccoli Cranberry Relish Grapefruit Salad Pumpkin Chiffon Pie INGREDIENTS:

1 cup uncooked white rice 2 cups water 1 teaspoon salt 3 tablespoons butter or margarine 1/2 cup chopped onion 1 cup fine dry bread crumbs 1 egg 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning

1 teaspoon salt 34 teaspoon poultry seasoning 1 cup chopped celery Dash of black pepper 34 cup water or turkey broth

METHOD: Spread rice in a shallow pan and place in a 400° **F**. oven. When the grains turn slightly yellow, stir well. Continue to toast, stirring occasion-ally, until rice grains are a light

golden color. This takes 15 to 20 minutes. Put the toasted rice in a saucepan. Add the water and salt. Bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover the saucepan with a lid and leave over this low heat 14 minutes. Remove from heat, but leave lid on 10 minutes.

While the rice is cooking, melt the butter or margarine in a saucepan. Add the onion and celery. Cook until tender, stirring occasionally. Add onion and celery mixture to the rice and mix in the bread crumbs, egg. salt, poultry seasoning, pepper and broth or water. Stuff lightly into the bird. Do not pack as the stuffing expands during the cooking. Stuff the bird just before it is placed in the oven. Do not stuff and refrigerate. This stuffing, however, may be prepared ahead of time so long as the liquids are not mixed with the dry ingredients until the turkey is to be stuffed and cooked. Extra stuffing can be baked in a separate pan or make about 6 cups of stuffing. Allow ¾ cup of stuffing for each pound of poultry, dressed weight, or 1 cup for each pound readyto-cook weight.

Frosted grapes are a lovely inexpensive and eatable garnish for turkey. Just dip grapes in slightly beaten egg whites and then into beet or cane sugar.





Texans Lose 170 Million Annually Because Of Rats

AUSTIN, Dec. 1. — Texans lose 170 million dollars every year on account of rats. They destroy and waste large quantities of food and are responsible for the spread of certain diseases to humans. "There is just one thing to do about rats," declares Dr. Henry A. Holle, Commissioner of Health, "and that is get rid of them."


Rats have been found to spread infectious hepatitis (jaundice), rabies, typhus fever, rat bite fever, dysenttery and other diseases. More eggs, chickens and small game are destroyed by rats than by all other animals. Sometimes they start destructive fires by gnawing wires and short circuiting them.

Exterminating rats is an endless process, if your building is not soundly protected against additional invasions. New buildings should be made rat-proof, and old ones can be made so at reasonable expense. Building rats out is a whole lot cheaper than having them around. Solid concrete or heavy metal are about the only materials that keep rats from entering a building, and unless foundations extend about two feet underground, rats can burrow underneath. You certainly cannot trust to luck — the rat is too clever and aggressive for that.

Red Squill is one of the poisons commonly used to kill rats, but this poison is not only death on rats, it is deadly for humans too. Warfarin is a comparatively new poison designed for killing rats — but it, too, is equally dangerous to humans. Both these poisons must be handled very carefully, and put out where neither children nor pets can get near them. Any kind of such poison must be stored in very safe places too.

If rats were starved out, by rat-proof construction, and with complete sanitation in our communities — around our homes and places of business, and all waste and trash were properly disposed of in sanitary land-fills — we would make an enormous economic saving and eliminate a real threat to health.


