

Rice is the source of excellent vegetable or incomplete protein, so toss it with meat or other animal foods in order to get its full nutritional value.

Breakfast dishes that team these foods together are rice pancakes, rice cooked in milk, rice muffins, or plain rice served with an egg or meat.

For dinner or supper, there are dishes such as oriental chicken pilaf, meat sauce and rice, pork chop casserole, rice pudding, rice and fish soup, and many others that combine the cereal and animal proteins.

For a "meal in a soup bow!" we tried this rice and fish dish in a large saucepan or soup kettle mixed together 1 cup uncooked rice; 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce, 1½ cups uncooked fresh, frozen or canned minced vegetable, 1 pound unthawed frozen fish fillets cut into inch long pieces, 3 teaspoons salt, ¼ teaspoon black pepper, and 3 cups water. Bring the mixture to a viborous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover with a lid and leave over this low heat 20 minutes. Add water if thinner soup is desired.


