Franks, constituting a quorum, and among other proceedings had by said Board of Directors was the following:

Whereas on the next ensuing second Tuesday, in January, being the 14th day of January, 1964, there will be elected four directors for this district;

Whereas this Board by order dated the 19th day of November, 1963 established the procedure for candidates who desire to file for said election;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF VALLEY CREEK WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT:

That an election be held in said district on the second Tuesday in January, 1964, the same being the 14th day of January, 1964, for the purpose of electing 4 directors to the Board of Directors of said District;

That said election shall be held at the following places 2 in said District, and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election.

1. For Election at Wingate, at Drug Store Building, in Wingate, Texas, with Bill Harman as Presiding Judge, and D. F. Bryan as Assistant Judge.

2. For Election in Old Norton, at Church of Christ Building, in Old Norton, Texas, within said District with Kirby Robinson as Presiding Judge and Pee Wee Hope as Assistant Judge.

The following named persons have duly filed as candidates for said election in accordance with the above mentioned order for election procedure in Directors Election passed by this board, and their names shall be placed on the ballot for said election in alphabetical order as follows: None.

Funeral Rites For R. L. Williams Held Tuesday

Funeral services for Roy L. Williams, 74, farmer for many years in the Wingate community, and an Abilene resident since 1952, were held Tuesday at 2 p. m. in Spill Memorial Chapel.

Mr. Williams died in Hendrick Memorial Hospital in Abilene at 4:50 a. m. Monday, after having been in ill health for several months and in the hospital since Nov. 25.

The Rev. Wayne Allen, pastor of Crescent Heights Baptist Church in Abilene, officiated at the services, assisted by the Rev. Bobby James, pastor of the Winters Assembly of God Church. Burial was in Lakeview Cemetery.

Born Feb. 6, 1889, in Rockdale, he married Mrs. Georgia Tribble Morris in 1914 at Caldwell. They came to Runnels County in 1919, settling in Winters. For a short time, he lived in San Angelo. His wife died Dec. 22, 1952.

Survivors include five sons, Lonnie Williams of Coalusa, Calif., H. C. Williams, Bill Morris, and L. G. Morris, all of Abilene, Clarence Morris of Law; two daughters, Mrs. Willie Jonas of Abilene, and Mrs. John Fletcher of Bangs; 23 grandchildren and a number of great-grandchildren.

Also surviving are four brothers, H. D. Williams and Albert Williams, both of Abilene; J. T. Williams of San Angelo, and E. E. (Red) Williams of National City, Calif.; one step-brother, Harry Statan of Abilene; three sisters, Mrs. J. F. Franklin, and Mrs. Sadie Kirby, both of Abilene; and Mrs. Mattie Rogers of Arlington; one step-sister, Mrs. Zella Stephenson of Abilene.

Funeral Rites Tuesday For Mrs. Hillyard

Funeral for Mrs. D. M. (Minnie L.) Hillyard, longtime resident of Winters, was held at 11 a. m. Tuesday in Spill Memorial Chapel, with burial in Fairview Cemetery.

Mrs. Hillyard died at 9:30 a. m. Monday in Sunshine Nursing Home in Abilene, where she had been a patient since Nov. 15. She had suffered a stroke Nov. 2.

Born Minnie L. Shurtliff near Stamps, Ark., Oct. 19, 1879, she moved with her parents to Rogers, Tex., when she was eight years old.

She married Mr. Hillyard Dec. 11, 1898 at Rogers, and in 1908 they moved to Ovalo, where he was associated with the bank. They moved to Winters in 1912, and he helped reorganize the First National Bank here.

Mr. Hillyard died in 1921. A daughter also preceded her in death in 1900.

Mrs. Hillyard had lived in Winters since 1912 except for a period between 1924 and 1928 while she lived in Abilene while her son attended college.

She was a Baptist and was active in the Eastern Star and Rebecca Lodge.

Survivors include a son, Otha, of Abilene; a brother, Houston Shurtliff of Colorado City, and a number of nieces and nephews.

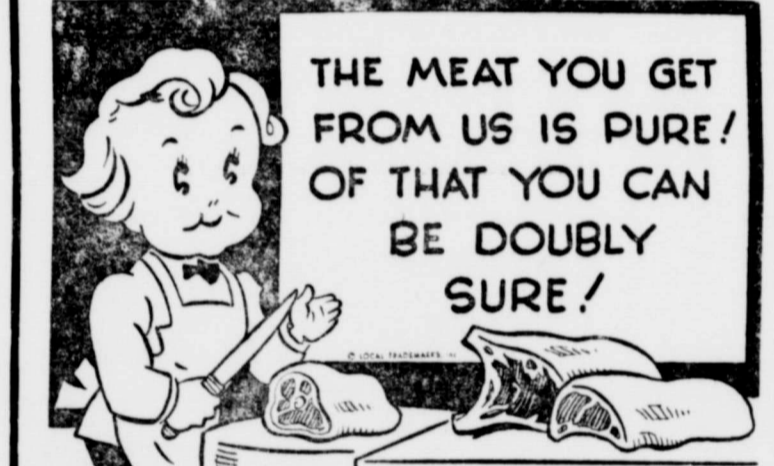
