## U. S. Emergency Drough! Aid For Eastland Co.

Eastland County was designated Friday as one of the West Texas counties eligible to benefit from the emergency drought relief program, Congressman Omar Burleson notified The Press. The designation was made by the Secretary of Agriculture on recommendation of the Governor.

The program, which will be administered by the Farm Home Administration with the assistance of the County PMA office, will enable livestock owners to obtain assistance in buying feed.

An allowance of 60 cents per hundred pounds on grain and protein feeds will be made, it was understood. In addition, the government will pay one-half of the freight costs up to \$10 per top on have

ton on hay.

The County FHA office, of which George I. Lane is the administrator, will operate the program with a county committee in charge. It was learned that two members of the committee are Jack Baker of Morton Valley and Leslie Hagaman of Ranger. A third member still was to be

confirmed.

Livestock raisers who wish to make application for aid under the program must obtain forms from the FHA, which were expected to be available early this week. When the applications are approved by the committee, they may be taken to any grain dealer in the county.

Callahan County was also on the new list.

## Health Programs Designed To Aid General Public

AUSTIN, August 26. — Dr. Henry A. Holle, State Health Officer, in outlining the duties of the Texas State Department of Health, said in a statement today that public health programs are

designed to benefit all the people. "In an effort to prevent disease," Dr. Holle said, "the Texas State Health Department carries on an educational program informing the public as to how they can secure protection by vaccination against smallpox, typhoid fever, and immunization against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus; by investigating sources of disease outbreaks; by isolating those ill with communicable disease; inspection of water supplies; advocating the production and use of safe milk to prevent the occurrence of milk borne diseases and many other services to the public.

Dr. Holle said that in spite of preventive measures, people will become ill and accidents will happen. In general, the cure of sickness in the individual and the repair of accidents fall within the scope of the duties of the private practitioner of medicine and surgery. "Of course," he said, "the private practitioner of medicine is also engaged in prevention of disease when he advises mothers to have their children and family protected against those diseases for which there is a known preventive."

The general practitioner and the State Department of Health both advocate that it is better to remain healthy than it is to recover from an illness, but the State Health Department is engaged in the prevention and control of disease as it affects the general population of a community or state.





### Success Of Farm **Operator In Dry** Area Is Reported

WEST POINT, Sept. 4. - Farmers hard-hit by dry weather this year, will be interested in learning how one Texas farmer managed to make 416 pounds of lint cotton per acre this year without a drop of irrigation and with only 3.25 inches of rain after

his seed were in the ground. The farmer is Clinton Harbers of West Point, Texas, in the Bastrop Fayette Soil Conservation District, and how he did it is told in the September issue of SOIL AND WATER magazine, now being mailed to landowners all over Texas.

Harbers' methods, as a series of articles in SOIL AND WATER have pointed out, involves no magic. Starting seven years ago and using unique legume-plant-ing methods and other ideas he has worked out for himself, he has built up the fertility of his land and consequently the waterholding capacity to the point where it takes much less rain for him to make a crop.

Last year, with sub-normal rain but more than he got this year, Harbers made 750 pounds of lint per acre on his cotton land.

This year, with a real drouth on his hands (he got only 6 inches of rain from January 1st right through his cotton season) he came out with 416 pounds of lint per acre, a phenomenal figure in a drouth.

"There is no substitute or rain," Harber says, "but we can get by on a lot less than we ever dreamed."
