EDUCATION IS GOOD BUSINESS, ACCORDING TO FEDERAL SURVEY

Funeral Held For Mrs. Prestridge

Editors Note - Below is a clipping taken from the Lubbock Avianch concerning the death of Mrs. Prestridge. The Prestridge family formerly lived here and will be remembered by many.

Mrs. Susie Prestridge, about 65, who alternately lived with her sister, Mrs. J. S. Seibern, 1902 27th St. and her daughter, Mrs. Bonnie Cogburn 6 miles southeast of Levelland, died at 9:30 a. m. Saturday in a Levelland Hospital following a heart attack.

She had been ill two years and recently had undergone surgery.

Funeral services were held at 17th St. and Ave N Church of Christ in Lubbock with burial in a Lubbock cemetery. Hoyt Seibern and P. M. Oden both of Lubbock, and W. F. Copeland, Deming, N. M., all Church of Christ ministers and nephews of Mrs. Prestridge, conducted the service.

Other survivors are a daughter, Mrs. Lee Hickerson of near Roswell, N. M., a son, Schoy Prestridge, Midland and 5 grandchildren.

DALLAS, Aug. 7. — Education is good business; the more schooling citizens have the better customers they are.

In the light of such facts, established by the U. S. Chamber of Commerce, the U. S. Labor Department's Wage-Hour Division here is urging all boys and girls who have not graduated to return to school this fall.

Furthermore, it hopes that every Texas community will conduct a back-to-school campaign of its own — in its own self-interest.

Regional Director William J. Rogers said pay checks may look good to minors who have been working during their summer vacation, "but they should look ahead — and so should the community in which they live."

Research by the U. S. Chamber of Commerce in 145 American cities shows clearly that the average educational level is directly related to total retail sales — the more schooling, the more sales.

Dallas, for instance, was ranked among the top 19 U. S. metropolitan areas of 250,000 population or more where the coverage adult has completed between 11 and 12 years of school. These same areas also had the highest retail sales, averaging \$1100 per capita.

Education, the official said, increases a person's earning power and improves his standard of living. The combination results in more retail sales for the community and more personal satisfaction for the individual.

Million Texans To Get Hunting, Fishing Licenses

AUSTIN, Aug. 3.—The License Clerk of the Game and Fish Commission said slightly less than one million hunting and fishing licenses for the fiscal year beginning September 1 are expected to be distributed.

The first consignments are being forwarded to the state's approximately 1700 licensed deputies so that they will be available for prompt issuance on the local level.

Actual sale of fishing and hunting licenses combined usually runs more than seven hundred thousand, according to the License Clerk.

Resident hunting licenses, under a comparatively new state law, sell for \$2.15. This certificate entitles the holder to hunt all kinds of game.

Resident fishing licenses sell for \$1.65 and cover all legitimate fishing routine. No license is required for sports fishing in salt water.

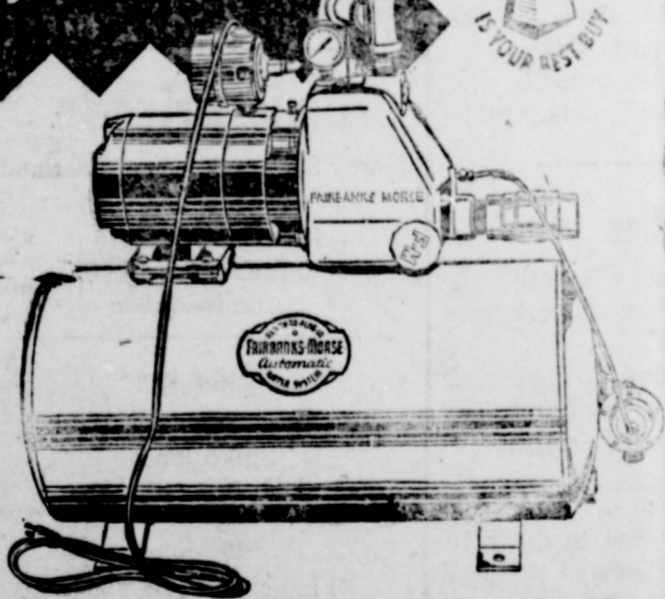

Roof Protection From Heat Being Studied By U of T

AUSTIN, Aug. 7. -- Better roof protection against the Southwest's blazing heat is the goal of new research at the University of Texas.

Assistant Professor R. A. Bacon is testing abilities of roof construction to resist heat or let it pass through. His research is expected to help engineers and architects plan roofs which will keep homes cooler in summer and warmer in winter.

"The roof is a primary factor in keeping any structure cool," Bacon asserts. "A roof bears the brunt of the sun's rays and in the Southwest usually is equal in area to outside walls."

A roof which insulates well can provide much living comfort when combined with a properly-used attic fan. It also can cut power costs for operating air-conditioning equipment, Bacon said.

Bacon has taken his research literally to the roof. He has built himself an eight-foot square laboratory atop the Engineering Building.

The laboratory roof is divided into four panels. One panel is two-inch-thick lightweight concrete; another, six-inch-thick lightweight concrete. A third panel is four-inch-thick sand and gravel concrete and a fourth is three-fourths-inch-thick pine boarding.

The lightweight concrete contains many air bubbles which insulate against heat. How much is not known. Engineers and builders aren't sure how pine boarding and heavier concrete react to heat. Bacon said he hopes to make those facts available.

Delicate electronic instruments measure surface heat on the inside and outside of each panel day and night. Temperature inside the laboratory remains constant. Other instruments measure the amount of heat passing through each panel.

Bacon, a mechanical engineer, plans to complete his roof tests by the end of summer, and will analyze his data next fall and winter, as teaching duties permit. The University's Bureau of Engineering Research is supporting his work.
