Representatives of the beef cattle industry met here Friday and created the Texas Beef Council, an organization designed to promote the consumption of beef in the Lone Star State.

The beef promotion sub committee of the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association was authorized to make preliminary studies to determine the specific needs of a beef promotion program and make recommendations for organigation and future activities of the newly created council.

Representatives of breed associations, commercial cattlemen, chamber of commerce executives and others attending the meeting voiced approval of the new organization and pledged support of its future activities.

Roy Parks, Midland, president of the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, presided at the meeting.

Jay Taylor, president of the American National Cattlemens' Association, explained that similar organizations in other states were already busy promoting beef. Taylor said that beef consumption had been increased as much as 40 percent in one state by a beef promotion program. Promotional materials have already been prepared by the American National Cattlemens' Association and are available to local, state and regional organizations for beef promotional pur-

Edward Neal of Beeville explained that a program sponsored by the South Texas Hereford Association raised retail meat sales in that city by 40 percent in

Organizations connected with the beef cattle industry will be invited to be represented on the Texas Beef Council.

All attending the meeting were in agreement that the beef industry must have a coordinated program of beef sales promotion in order to meet the ever-increasing competition from other meat products
