Huge Sums Paid After Accidents

People in Texas were paid \$20,537,994 by casualty insurance companies, for personal injuries arising out of automobile accidents on highways during 1952 T. R. Mansfield, president of the Southwestern Insurance Information Service of Dallas, reported today.

"During the same year," Mansfield said, "Property damage losses were paid to the public in the amount of \$14,732,818; and automobile, fire, theft and collision payments to insurance policyholders amounted to \$36,969,-959. For other losses, casualty insurance companies paid \$9,195,-632, making a total of \$81,436,403 paid to the people of Texas."

National Award Events Renewed

Two additional national 4-H award programs have been renewed by the State Extension Service for 1954.

The programs and the donors are: 4-H Citizenship, in honor of Thos. E. Wilson, chairman of the National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work, and Community Relations, Gene Autry and Wm. Wrigley Jr. Co.

In both programs, each boy and girl state winner receives a Certificate of Honor. Eight state winners in Community Relations will be selected for a sectional award, which is an all-expense trip to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago next Novem-

The two national winners - a boy and a girl -- in each of the programs will receive a \$300.00 college scholarship.

Dogs Are Hazard To Wild Animals In Spring Season

tive Secretary of the Texas Game and Fish Commission suggested Texans can aid wildlife by keeping their dogs from running wild at this time of the year.

He said the Animal Kingdom is now at a crucial spring period when birds are nesting and when mammals are bearing their young.

The Commission already has received complaints from scattered state areas that dogs have been chasing doe deer heavy with fawn. Some reports indicate canines have harassed newly-born fawn deer.

"This is not the dogs' fault," explained the Executive Secre-"A dog's instinct is to chase things. Any old hound likes nothing better than to take off in the brush after some living thing.

"Therefore, it is strictly up to the owners to restrain their dogs. Dogs in areas where wildlife abounds should be penned up or put on a leash during the cur- Harris, Carbon, Texas.

rent critical days. Later on, vildlife will be better able to take care of itself.

The Executive Secretary also emphasized the havoc wroght by wild house cats, most of which are turned loose by their city owners to get rid of them.

"This is another case where the pets are not to blame," he said. 'Certainly, if a cat used to domesticity is turned loose in the wilds, it has to begin looking out for its own food. That means it begins preying on wild life.

"Right now inestimable damage results from cats raiding the young of game birds, particularly the ground nesting varieties, such as quail and wild turkey, and ev-en wild ducks." Incidentally, the Executive Secretary quoted a biologist's report that roaming dogs do more damage to duck nests in the coastal marshes than any other predator.
