First Baptist Church To Observe Anniversary

The First Baptist Church of Winters will observe its 85th anniversary Sunday, March 23, with a homecoming service.

The Rev. B.T. Shoemaker, of Spearman, a former pastor of the church, will bring the morning message.

A picnic lunch will be served at noon in Fellowship Hall, and an all-church singing service will follow. Items of historical interest will be on display.

In addition to the Rev. Shoemaker, the Rev. L.L. Trott of Abilene and the Rev. Harry Grantz of Breckenridge are the only living former pastors. They have been sent special invitations to attend this anniversary event.

A goal of 18 new members for the year has been set in honor of the charter members, and an increase of 85 in

Sunday School attendance for Sunday, according to the Rev. David Crooks, pastor.

The First Baptist Church was organized under the name of Bethel Baptist, March 22, 1890, by 18 people who met in a small school building. The name of the church was changed to Winters Baptist in 1903, and eventually became the First Baptist Church.

The group met in the school house until 1906, when a frame church building was constructed. A modern church was erected in 1915. In 1950, an educational building was added to the property and a new sanctuary was built in 1958. The old church building, which had been used since 1958 for classrooms was demolished several months ago to make room for additional planned construction.

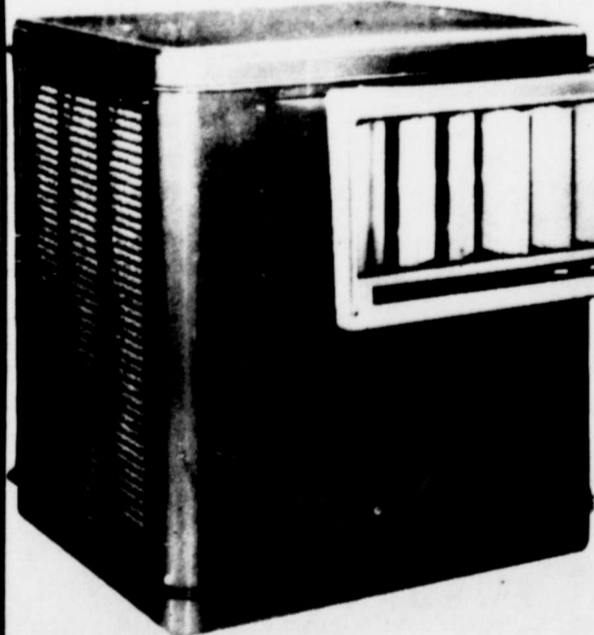
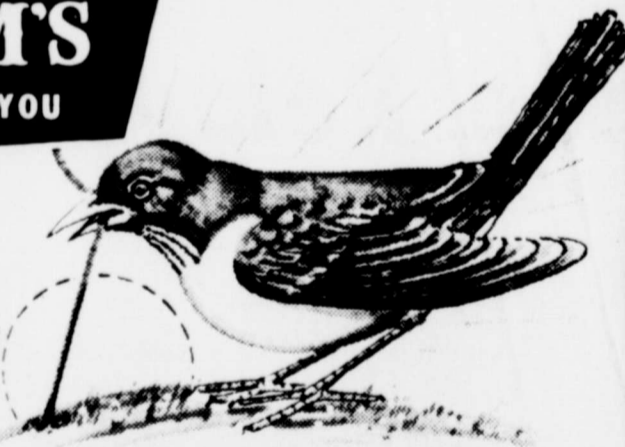

Miss Tatum was born at Coleman, but her family moved to Winters when she was in the first grade. Miss Tatum is engaged to marry Joe Lombard of Fort Wayne, Ind. in June. He is employed by Cleveland Athletics in Plainview, and will graduate from Wayland College in May.

Miss Tatum has been on the Hale Center faculty for the past two years, and has been assistant girls' coach. She will take over as head coach at the end of the present school term. Miss Tatum is a 1969 graduate of Winters High School, where she was an outstanding basketball star. A graduate of Wayland College, she was selected in 1972 as Miss Wayland College, and represented that school in the Miss Texas Pageant in Fort Worth. While a student at Wayland, she coached the Queen Bees one year.

She joined the Hale Center school in 1973 and has served as Owlette freshman and junior varsity coach for the past two seasons.
