> The First Baptist Church was organized under the name of Bethel Baptist, March 22, 1890, by 18 people who met in a small school building. The name of the church was changed Winters Baptist in 1903, and eventually became the First Baptist Church.

The group met in the school house until 1906, when a frame church building was constructed. A modern church was erected in 1915. In 1950, an educational building was added to the property and a new sanctuary was built in 1958. The old church building, which had been used since 1958 for classrooms was demolished several months ago to make room for additional planned


