Chandler Company Cements Another **Oiler Near Carbon**


Clark P. Chandler et al of San Angelo apparently had another good oil producer in their Day-Griffin pool near Mangum, seven miles southeast of Cisco, after pipe had been cemented today in their No. 2 N. B. Eaves.

Located in Section 20, Block 3, H&TC Survey, the No. 2 Eaves test flowed on drill stem and pipe was cemented.

Chandler had filed a completion report for his No. 2-C Ethel Hittson Coates, completed recently as a Ranger sand pro-ducer in Section 9, Block 3, H&TC Survey. The well flowed 133 barrels of 42.6 gravity oil through a 12-64s inch choke with packer on the casing and 450 pounds of tubing pressure. Production was from 26 perforations at 3,307-14 feet. Gas-oil tained a permit to arm a win oil test as a 4,000-foot rotary project in Eastland County six and a half miles southwest of Carbon. It will be . Chandler's No. 1-A Tyler and Breeding. 

Dallas Office To Continue Serving Texas Veterans

DALLAS, April 3. - The Veterans Administration Dallas Regional Office located at 912 South Ervay Street will continue to serve the veterans in the 51county region of northeast Texas without any change in operations after the VA District Office moves to Denver, Colorado. There will be on change in the services rendered to veterans living throughout the regional area in northeast Texas.

The out-patient Medical and Dental treatments and examinations, pension and disability compensation, guarantee of loans for GI houses, farms, and businesses, the training and rehabilitation of eligible veterans, guardianship of incompetent and minor beneficiaries, and all other programs and services of the Dallas Regional Office will continue to be performed as in the past.

"This announcement," said Scott B. Harrington, Regional Manager, "appears appropriate at this time because of the hundreds of inquiries we are receiving from worried veterans and beneficiaries who fear they may have to go to Denver for their regional office services.
