PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION, TO BE SUBMITTED T0 VOTE OF THE PEOPLE ON TUESDAY NOVEMBER, $4,1902$. J. R. No. $3 . \quad$ Joint resolution.

Amending Article 5, Section 2, of the Constitution of the State of Texas requiring all persons subject to a poll tax to have paid a poll tax and to hold a receipt for same before they offer to vote at
ny election in this State and fixing the time of payment of said $t a x$.
be it resolved by the legislature oe the state oe texas: Section 1. That Article 6 Section 2 of the Constitution of the State Texas bo amended so as to hereafter read as follows: Section 2. Every male person subject to none of the foregoing disqualifications, who shall have attained the age of twenty-one years and who shall be a citizen of the United States, and who shall have resided in this state one year preceding an election and he last six months within the district or county in which he offers of foreign birth subject to none of the foregoing disqualifications who not less than six menths before any election disqualifications, to vote, shall have declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States in accordance with the Federal Naturalization of the and shall have resided in this state one year next preceeding such election and the last six months in the county in which hing such vote, shall also be deemed a qualified elector; and all electors vote in the election precinct of their residence; providers shall electors living in unorganized county may vote at any edion that cinct in the county to which such county is attached election pre purposes; and provided further, that any voter who for jud.cial pay poll tax under the laws of the State of Texas shall have paid said poll tax before he offers to vote at any election in this State and hold a receipt showing his poll tax paid before the first day of Februaly next preceding such election. Or if said voter shall have lost or misplaced said tax receipt, he shall be entitled to vote upon making affidavit before any officer anthorized to administer oaths that such tax receipt has been lost. Such affidavit shall be made in writing and left with the judge of the election, and this provision of the Constitution shall be self-enacting without the necessity of further legislation.
Sec. 3 The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue he necessary proclamation submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of Texas at the next general election.
