

ELECTIONS—MANNER of HOLD ING AND MAKING RETURNS

An act to regulate elections and to prescribe penalties for its violation.

PENALTIES FOR VIOLATING ELEC-TION LAWS.

Sec. 108. Any person who is found guilty of a misdemeanor under this act for a violation of its provisions, shall be subject rolls, and insert in the rolls corto a fine of not less than two hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or sentenced to hard labor on the public roads of the county in which the offense was committed for any period of time, not more than one year, or to both such punish-

Sec 109.—Any person who at a general or special election, or at a primary election or primary convention of a party, wilfully votes or attempts to vote in any other name than his own, or more than once, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 110 Any person who votes or offers to vote at a primary election or primary convention of a political party, having voted at a primary. election or convention of any other party on the same day, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 112. Any person being an officer, clerk or employee of or in the office of county collector of taxes, precinct judge, or clerk of election, who knowingly puts opposite the name of a voter on a poll tax receipt or exemption certificate rolls, or any official copy thereof, any other number than that first written, or knowingly delivers to or receives from any voter any poll tax receipt or exemption certificate on which is any other name than that placed opposite the voter's name when it was first issued, is guilty of a misdemeanor.



Condition of Cotton Along Frisco Road.

The regular weekly report of cotton conditions along the Frisco road is issued from the office of the general agent, Preston, and with the exception of the need of rain in many sections, the report makes a very fair showing.

Brady-Acreage 30,000; yield per acre one-third of a bale. Past week has been very good on cotton. The crop will be late but will still be a good one.

Comanche-Acreage 100,000 with a yield of one-fifth of a bale to the acre. The general condition is good. Cotton is being marketed fast. Rains general in this section. No pest. Heavy erop assured. Conditions favorable for an average top crop. There are 90,000 acres in corn tributary to this place. There were I,000 bushels of wheat and 4000 bushels of oats harvested.

Cresson—Acreage 1500; will go one-fourth of a bale. Condition of cotton is fairly good. Rain is needed for cotton. Other crops are made with the exception of ships nothing but himself. hay.

Proctor—Acreage 4500; condition indifferent. No rain during the past week. Some cotton fields are dying in spots. Yield now expected to exceed that of last season.

Stephenville—Acreage 38,760; general condition fair; no rain. Weather conditions dry and windy. General opinion is that cotton has been considerably injured and will not make over an average crop. No complaint from bugs and worms. Dry great enough to be himself. winds causing cotton to throw

Granbury-Acreage 10,000; general conditions good. Cotton is suffering for rain. High winds make it look bad.

Gunter-Acreage 10,000; will make one-half bale to the acre. Conditions good. Cotton holding up well, but rain is needed.

Prosper-Acreage, 30,000; will make half bale to the acre; conditions fair, but is beginning to suffer on account of rain. Crop is full of blooms.

Dublin-Acreage, 44,000; will make one third of a bale. Conditions are an average. Cotton has done no good the past week. Movement will begin about September 1.




