

The following statutes are not generally known so we give them below for the benefit of the pub-

Art. 400a, Sec. 2.—That any person who shall sell, give or barter, or cause to be sold, given or bartered, to any person under the age of sixteen years, or knowingly sell to any other per son for delivering to such minor, without the written consent of the parent or guardian of such minor, any cigarette or tobacco in any of its forms, shall be fined not ess than ten nor more than one hundred dollars. (Acts 1899)

Sec. 1.—Any person who shall knowingly sell or give, or cause to be sold or given, or shall be instrumental in selling, giving or procuring, of any spirituos, vinous or malt liquors, or medicated bitters capable of producing intoxication, to any person who is an habitual drunkard, shall be fined not less than twen ty-five nor more than one hund red dollars.

Sec. 2.-An habitual drunkard, within the meaning of this Act, is one who makes it a habit to get drunk, or who habitually becomes intoxicated by the voluntary use of intoxicating liquors. (Acts. 1903.)

Sec. 143. The penalties by this act shall be given in charge grand juries.

Sec. 145. [Note-The enrolled bill shows that the foregoing act passed the House of Representatives by vote, yeas 70, nays 29; and was referred to the Senate where same was amended and passed by a two-thirds vote, yeays 22, ate amendments, no vote given.]






