
The sermon was strong and beautiful and was well received by an appreciative andience.







Russia's Argus Eve.

In the Russian post office a watchful eye is kept on all newspapers and magazines, and any matter officially considered objectionable is ruthlessly "blacked out." A similar surveillance is extended to private correspondence. The task thus under taken is a gigantic one, but the Russian official system has proved itself equal to the undertaking.

In every post office of import ance there are officials constituting the "black cabinet," whose duty it is to examine the letters received According to the system followed in the Moscow post office, all the letters are handed over to the "black 'cabinet." Then one official sorts out all those which are address ed to suspected families, another all those addressed in suspected handwritings, while a third arranges the remainder in little heaps and then draws at random several letters from each heap Al the letters selected in these various ways are than opeald and examined.

In this ingenious way the Russian government strives to keep a continual check on the free in tercourse of its subjects, and it is not surprising that "under ground" means of communica tion have been developed.

Death to Johnson Grass. Prof. J. W. Spillman, agrostologist of the United States Department of Agriculture, has been in the vicinity of Columbus, Colorado county, Texas, inspecting the experiments which are being conducted on the farm of J. B. Gay for the purpose of finding methods of exterminating Johnson Grass. After visiting the experimental fields, Mr. Spillman was enthusiastic over the results.

It has been demonstrated beyond question that Johnson grass can be completely eradi cated by means that are entirely practicable, and a bulletin will be issued this winter giving the details of the experiments and the results obtained.
