Death to Johnson Grass. Prof. J. W. Spillman, agrostol ogist of the United States Department of Agriculture, has been in the vicinity of Columbus, Colorado county, Texas, inspecting the experiments which are being conducted on the farm of J. B. Gay for the purpose of find ing methods of exterminating Johnson Grass. After visiting the experimental fields, Mr the results
It has been demonstrated be yond question that Johnson grass can be completely eradi cated by means that are entirely practicable, and a bulletin wil be issued this winter giving the details of the experiments and the results obtained. These re sults indicate that excellen crops, practically free from Johnson grass, may be grown on badly infested land if the land is plowed both in fall and spring and treated with a root digge after each plowing. To complete ly eradicate the grass a smal portion of the farm may be treat ed at a time so that the loss of season's use of the land may not be serious. The part to be treat ed should be plowed in the fall with a dise or turning plow. The root digger should then be run both ways over the land. Re peat the plowing and root dig ging in the spring then run a sweep over the field frequently during the summer. This wil completely eradicate the pest.Texas Live Stock Journal.
