The past year has been the hardest on our water system in its history, an unusual hard winter causing freezing and bursting of mains and service pipes; two droughts tnreatening exhaustion or the water supply, old machin ery breaking down on several occasions, and increased consumption of water, yet all these the city supplied with water, and the revenue from rent more than doubled.
It is imperative that a new
boiler and pump be installed with and pump be installed with as litte delay as possible,
the boiler now in use is unsafe and the pump is not dependable. The water supply is insufficient and in view of the fact that the city must have new machinery
