After considerable discussion Judge M. C. Smith offered certain resolutions favoring the installation of a pumping station on the Colorado River these resolutions were voted down by a vote of 16 to 6.

It seemed to be the desire of the majority of this assembly that the City Council go ahead and expend the money derived from the sale of the bonds as outlined by Mr. Hawley, the Civil Engineer from Fort Worth, whom the Council engaged to furnish plans and specifications some time ago.
