man Hamill for selling intoxicat ing liquor upon these prescriptions and the remainder were against the Doctors who gave the prescriptions. After four of these cases had been tried and verdicts of not guilty rendered in each of them the other 1435 were dismissed. It was never on the part of Chairman Hami who made the sales, or of the doctors who gave the prescriptions upon which the sales were made to violate the local-option law; but on the other hand was perfectly clear that they were attempting to comply with the provisions of the law allowing such sales to be made by druggists.
