Mrs. Medford Buried Friday At Rising Star

Mrs. Annie M. Medford, 74, died at 8:45 a.m. Thursday in the Eastland Memorial Hospital. She had been a resident of an Eastland nursing home and entered the hospital one hour before her death.

Funeral was held at 2 p.m. Friday in the Arrington Hamner Funeral Chapel with the Rev. Len Layne, pastor of the First United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial was held in the Rising Star Cemetery.

She was born April 15, 1895 in Ardmore, Oklahoma, and had lived at 703 S. Halbryan for 20 years. Prior to that time, she lived in the Okra Community in the south part of Eastland County. She married William Medford in 1916 in Avery. She was a member of the Methodist Church.

County Land Owners Begin Fight On Brush

Twenty-five Eastland County land owners voted to begin raising funds for brush control and range improvement research in a meeting May 16th. John Matthews, Abilene area rancher and chairman of the Texas Brush Control and Range Improvement Association, discussed the objectives of the association with the land owners.

County Chairman Jamie Fry of Cisco said the association was formed last November by a group of land owners to raise funds to fight brush invasion of rangelands, one of Texas' major agricultural problems, and study methods of range improvement.

Fry said the plan is to solicit one cent per acre from each Texas landowner each year for five years. He reported that \$158.00 had been contributed during the first five days of the drive in Eastland County.

Matthews told the landowners that the BXRIA is a non-profit organization not directly associated with any university, company or agency. An 18 member board of directors, representing different areas of the state, is directing activities.

Money collected will sup-

port expanded research and education on brush control and range improvement. The best research projects, submitted by universities and other agencies will be funded by the association.

He said at least 80 per cent of Texas rangelands are infested with brush and weeds, reducing their carrying capacity by 50 per cent or more. Not only is brush control important to ranchers, but the problem also affects the economy of all agricultural communities in the state.

Research by universities and the USDA have done much toward brush control, Matthews stated, but it is clear that greater financial support of research is needed if we are to solve the problem.

Contributions, which are income tax deductible, can be sent to Jamie Fry, Box 31, Cisco, Texas, or to any bank in Eastland County. Checks should be made payable to the association. Land owners may contribute one cent per acre each year for the next five years or may contribute the entire amount at one time.

Contributions by every land owner are needed in this campaign to win the brush fight, Fry said.

Coastal, Weeping Love Keys To Pastures Here

What is Pasture Management and its purpose? It is the proper treatment and use of pastureland to prolong the life of desirable forage species; maintain or improve the quality or quantity of forage; provide soil protection and reduce water losses.

The two most common grasses found on our pastures in Eastland County are Weeping lovegrass. Coastal Bermuda is a vigorous growing warm-season perennial

seed-forming grass which reproduces from both rhizomes and stolons but not from seed. It was developed and released from the Coastal Plains Experiment Station, Tifton, Ga., as an intraspecific hybrid of a vigorous strain of Common Bermuda called Tift and a tall growing strain of Common Bermuda from South Africa. Weeping lovegrass is a perennial warm-season bunch grass that was developed in South Africa and can be planted by seeds at the rate of about 9 lbs. per acre. High quality green pasture

is the most economical method of beef production. The type of grass, rate of fertilizer application and specific management practice necessary will usually pay good dividends. Although there are differences among grasses in their actual response to fertilizer, they require four major plant nutrients which are nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, and calcium.

One should not attempt to establish improved pasture plants on low fertility soil without application of fertilizers, and it should be recognized that soils too poor to grow desirable plants produce low quality forage.

Rotational grazing is recommended for improved pastures, and a stocking rate to graze-off the forage in three to five weeks will usually give the highest yield of beef.
