## Exterminate Johnson Grass.

 I do not hesitate to say th with our present knowledge Johnson grass we can grow it a hay crop in rotation with corcotton and other crops witho any serious trouble from it as weed. On a farm that is alread infested, I do not hesitate to $r$ commend that the farmer utiliz this grass for hay and pasture
The whole secret of destroyin The whole secret of destroying
this pest lies in the following this pest lies in the following
facts which have recently been well ascertained: In the spring of the year the rootstalks which are left over in the ground from the previous year have only one purpose-that is, to send secondary growth toward the surface tootstalks new plants. These ol the soil the second yead through do nothing what ever excep the old rootstalks in the fall the year begin to decay, and we have yet to find a single one o them that lives over and send up the new growth the second year.
About the time the Johnson grass heads out, or at least by the time it begins to blossom, a new crop of underground stem the plants which have grown of the plants which have grown during the season, If the John son grass is allowed to ripen seed these new rootstalks grow to b very large, and especially soft, cultivated foil, descend great depths in the soil, And
