400 The Government Cotton report 25 reached Ballinger Wednesday at 25 noon and caused the market 5 to jump up a few points. The 25 estimate of the 1908 crop is 12,-100 920, 000 bales, and falls far be-5 low the estimates of many cot-250 ton men. It has been previously 25 predicted that the crop would be 500 between thirteen and fourteen 255 million bales. Three years ago 50 a fourteen million bale crop sold 500 for an average of ten cents. This 225 being the case it seems that a 115 thirteen million bale crop should 100 sell for at least ten cent. The 137 report made a flurry upwards of a few points, but soon dropped back about the previous price.



#### Want Change in Game Law

Local sportsmen have joined in a state-wide movement asking the legislature to change one of no matter what the name. If it fails, the provisions of the game law making the open season on doves begin on September 1 instead of November 1. Farmers are signing the petition to the legislature declaring that doves do more damage in the month of September than in the following two months. It is also argued that the doves migrate after the last of September and go to other

The petition to the 31st legislature commends the existing Jaw as being the wiest and best game law on the statue books and asks that no other povision be changed except that relating to the open season on doves. The clause forbidding the selling of game is especially upheld and the efforts of the Northern Market men to appeal this section of the law is deprecated by the signers of the petition.





Show Men Like Apes.

Prehistoric paintings recently unearthed show man to have been like an ape. The only known examples of paintings of men by prehistoric cave decorators have been discovered lately by Prof. Rene Leaunel in the Portel grotto, a cave of Louhens, in Ariege France, where Noulet already had found quaternary remains and human bones. About 40 sketches in black or red, only one in both colors, adorn the cave as frescoes, and two represent men of a primitive type, while the others show bisons, boars and horses. Of the human figures one has a long head, with retreating forehead, while the other shows a remarkable apelike pose, with rounded back and arms pendent in front. There is a cruoching boar, but the horses are mostly galloping and poorly drawn, although the forequarters of a horse are quite skillfully figured in black on one of the darkest walls of the cavern.

Cost of Production Should Always Be a Factor in the Matter of Prices.

Profits should bear an equitable relation to cost of production. The farmer who has money invested in lands. agricultural implements, stocks, and other things necessary to carry on his business, when selling his products must take into consideration the interest on his money invested, the wear and tear of farm equipment, the wages of hired help and a salary for his own service.
