#### COTTON RECEIPTS FRON TWO TOWNS

A reporter called at the public weigher's office Thursday morning to get a report of Abilene's cotton receipts for 1907-08 and he gave us the total receipts at his yard of the crop of 1907 at 16,000, and of the 1908 crop he has weighed in 22,525 bales.

At the Farmers Union warehouse, up to noon today, 5,350 bales have been weighed in, against 2,707 bales on same date last year.

#### Cost of Raising Cotton.

Discussing the editoral in last week's issue of Farm & Ranch, the actual cost of raising cotton W. B. Yeary of Farmersville. figures and comments:

"In dealing with this question," said Mr. Yeary, "there are so many elements of uncertainty that enter into the cost of making a bale of cotton that we must base our estimates on ideal weather conditions; or in other words, we must be able to work our cotton whenever it needs working, chop it and pick it at the right times.

"Ideal weather conditions give us production at a menimum expense. Any variation from this standard will cause an extra cost of production, or a decreased return from the soil.

"My estimate must also deal with the average black land soil and the aveaage black land farmer- The better equipped a man is the cheaper he can produce his crop. We must also have a smoothe piece of land that has been cultivated so that an average day's work may be done. Broken land will of course, be more expensive to the work.

"Let the value of a man and his team be \$3 per day. Then the cost per acre for handling the crop to the time of picking will berring up the land; 35 cents; planting, 35 cents; seed 25 cents; first chopping, 75 cents; second chopping, 50 cents; second, third and fourth plowings, \$1.

"The average production per acre in our part of the country is about one-third of a bale. On this hypothesis, we find the following costs: picking at 75 cents per hundred, season average, \$3:75: time of man and team at gin, 50 cents; ginning expenses \$1; time consumed in marketing, 35 cents; rent of land, \$5. This makes a total cost of \$16.75 to raise one-third of a bale of cot-

"If cotton sells at 10 cents per pound and seed at 15 per ton, the farmer, will get \$19.16 for his one-third of a bale and its seed. His profit in this instance is \$2.41

"With cotton at 9 cents per pound and seed at \$15 per ton, the profit is 75 cents per acre.

"With cotton at 8 cents and seed at \$15 per ton, the loss is \$2.92 per acre.

"The same scale of computations may be made for what ever price cotton and cotton seed will bring or for whatever yield may Sir;be obtained. The cost of raising a third of a bale is just as great as raising a bale to the acre up the cost is proportionate for the quantity of the yield, but the total returns are very much

'This estimate has not included the wear and tear of machinery, nor the expence of fertilization, replanting, rechopping from excessive rain. These are expenses that must also be provided for. Every few years new implements must be bought and about every ten years a new team must be provided. - Farm p. m. This is a very important

The Fort Worth market receipt for 1908 show that the farmers of Texas are increasing their hog crop, and the farmers bank accounts will show that the crop is a paying one. The total hog receipts for the Ft. Worth market for 1907 was 487,697, and for 1908 was 702,850, an increase of 215,171, and a better price was paid for 1908 hogs than for the 1907, showing conclusively that the demand was not supplied with the big increase. Cotton is not the only paying crop, even in this county where feed is so easily produced.

Ballinger Banner-Leader: If the season is favorable, something like ten thousand young fruit trees will bear in the South Ballinger orchards this year. This, with the fruit from the old trees, will create a demand for a canning factory here. 

But if capital-which is proverbially timid and reluctantfails or refuses to establish a canning factory at Ballinger, the owners of the fruit trees needn't let their crops go to ruin on the ground. There are small canning outfits, sold at prices ranging from a few dollars to a few hundred dollars, which, when energetically utilized, can be made wonderfully effective in saving fruit for the ever voracious market and putting money into the growers' capacious pockets, - Dallas News.




