Then a lone horseman, leaning low over the neek of his pony, galloped towards Madero's headquarters to inform the provisional president of the victory, and the Juarez house tops became alive with rebel fighters. Seven-ty-five prisoners liberated from the cuartel came swarming into Elpaso.
