

Fertilizer Used.

Mr. Dean who farms the old Fold Ivy irrigated farm across the Colorado was persuaded by E. L. Rasbury to try 600 pounds of fertilizer on 3 acres of irrigated land, putting 200 pounds to the acre, and from these three acres so fertilized he gathered one and one-half bales per acre and on adjoining land that was irrigated beside the three acres on which fertilizer was used, he gathered one bale per acre, which is abundant proof that it will pay to use the fertilizer on irrigated land for the reason that the water from the river seems to kill the soil.







ONE ACRE OF LAND.

What Ery Farming Methods will do for the Farmer.

In the Spring of 1909, while living in Jefferson county, Oklahoma, I set apart one acre of land to use as a "private experiment station." It was a dry Spring in that vicinity and continued on very dry all Summer and Fall. I plowed this acre of land almost as twice deep as the average field in this state is plowed. In fact I have for years been an advocate of deep plowwhile preparing the soil for a crop of any kind, but I plowed this one acre two inches deeper than usual. I harrowed and cross harrowed it until there was a perfect dust mulch two incher deep rain came, I would harrow and ten days.

I did not plant anything on this land until the middle of July.
