## Crop Insurance For County By 1970

The state committee on Federal Crop Insurance met April 13 to begin an all-out effort to secure Federal Crop Insurance coverage for Eastland County in 1970.

Federal Crop Insurance is insured by — and backed by the United States Department of Agriculture. The insurance program is administered by the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation. The program has been in operation for several years and covers some 24 different crops in 24 counties.

F.C.I.C. insures against loss of crops due to drought, flood, fertilizer, pesticides and other production factors. Farmers are guaranteed a large enough to pay the expenses. The farmer's crop is insured against loss except for normal practices.

Farmers do not have to be paid a premium. Farmers can work and harvest time to pay, with interest or other charges on delayed payment.

The insurance are set up by the county approved cases. No administrative cost is charged against premium. All premium dollars are paid back to the farmer or set aside for his own use.

Supplications by local farmers and businessmen and other interested people must be submitted to the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation in Washington, D. C. or reviewed in order to determine local interest in Eastland County for insurance coverage.

## THE PEANUT REPORT ...

The Potential for manufacturing peanut products in this area.

### INTRODUCTION

Two Texas counties, Eastland and Comanche, are the center of the most important peanut production in the Southwest. It is the purpose of this study to illustrate the opportunities which exist for utilization of this valuable raw material in the manufacturing of peanut products in the Eastland-Comanche Area and, specifically, in the communities of DeLeon, Eastland, Gorman and Ranger.

This study begins by exploring the structure of the peanut industry. Then the economic determinants of peanut products manufacturing which exist in the Eastland-Comanche Area are analyzed and evaluated, and the opportunities for peanut butter, salted peanut, and candy production in the Eastland-Comanche Area are defined.

Every effort was exercised to obtain information from the most reliable sources, but Texas Electric Service Company assumes no responsibility for the decisions which may result from its use. We would be glad to have interested persons make independent investigations of any facts presented in this study and to arrive at their own conclusions with respect thereto.

## County Is Ahead Bond Sale Quota

According to a report received today from Mr. H. M. Pentress, area Chairman of the Savings Bonds Committee, the sale of United State Savings Bonds and Freedom Shares in Eastland County during the month of March totaled \$94,595. Quarterly sales totaled \$149,761 or 59 per cent of the 1969 goal of \$399,000.

During the first quarter of 1969 sales in Texas totaled \$46,758,377—an increase of 1-7 per cent over sales during the same period of 1968. March sales were \$13,591,597 as compared to \$14,174,187 during 1968.

Total sales over the Nation during March were \$381 million bringing sales for the first quarter to \$1,247 million.
