$\mathrm{H}_{\text {The Bible says } \sin \text { has been on }}^{\text {this earth as long }}$ this earth as long as people have
lived there. But the story of the lived there. But the story of the
temptation in the Garden of Eden is also a parable of how sin alway
begins. begins.
Now we can see in this story
that sin came into the world that sin came into the world
because there eame a sugges-
tion from the because there came a sugges-
tion from the outside. Not everything in this universe is now
good; there is anti-God at good; there is anti-God at
work, as well as pro-God. There are forces at work that do not
wish God's plans to succeed.
If this seems hard to take, at
least it cannot be denied that
great many sins would never have been committed without some pull
from the outside. A child who goes tom the outside. A child who goes
to school for the first time will pick up, in a few days, habits and
language and attitudes that shock language and attitudes that shock
