

follow these recipes. Vegetables for the meal and the salad are seasonal, and thus economical; so, too, is the ice cream with its lovely green plums that require no preparation except the

*Lamb Shoulder Roast

Before roasting shoulder of lamb, be sure to note its weight in order to determine the proper cooking time. Low cooking temperature is important for best results. For roasting, wipe meat with a damp cloth, sprinkle with salt and pepper and place on a rack in an open pan. Insert a meat thermometer into a part of the roast which is free from fat and gristle. Roast in a low oven (325°) for 35 minutes per pound or until meat thermometer registers an internal temperature of

If you like a hint of garlic flavoring in the lamb roast, do this: Grate clove of garlic and mix with 2 tablespoons olive oil or melted butter. Before roasting, cover the top of the lamb with this mixture, using a pastry brush.

HERE'S A TASTY way to use the leftover portion of the lamb roast: Creamed Lamb on Toast

(Serves 6) 3 cups cold, cooked lamb, diced

tablespoons flour cups milk

Salt and pepper Paprika Button Mushrooms

Make a white sauce of the butter, flour and milk. Season with salt and pepper to



taste. Add meat and mushrooms, cut in slices. Serve hot on toast triangles. Garnish with a paprika and a

*Quick Celery Crescents (Makes 1 dozen rolls)

I package dry yeast 14 cup warm water (105°-110°) 1/2 cup milk

1 tablespoon sugar

teaspoon sait 3 tablespoons soft shortening 2 cups sifted flour

Melted butter

Celery seeds, salt Add yeast to water and let stand. Scald milk and pour into a large bowl with sugar, salt and shortening. Blend together and cool to lukewarm. Stir yeast mixture and pour into bowl. Mix in flour, one cup at a time. Place in a greased bowl. Cover with a damp cloth and let rise in a warm place for 30 minutes. Punch down. Toss dough onto lightly floured board. Roll into a 12inch circle, 1/4-inch thick. Brush with melted butter. Cut into 12 pieshaped pieces. Stretch wider end of each piece a little as you roll, so the long point winds up on the outside. Curve ends to form a crescent. Brush with beaten egg. Sprinkle with celery seeds and salt. Let rise

for 15 minutes. Bake in a hot (400°) oven for 12 to 15 minutes.

 Franconia Potatoes Wash and peel medium-sized potatoes. Rinse well in cold water. Parboil for 10 minutes, then place in pan in which meat is roasting. Bake until fork tender, about 45 minutes, basting with fat in the pan. Before

serving, season with salt and dust with paprika. Either asparagus or green peas are a good choice for a vegetable with the lamb dinner. Pay special attention to seasonings if you want

*Minted Peas

them to be at their best.

Cook green peas in a small quantity of boiling, salted water. Season with butter and minced mint leaves. Toss until leaves are well mixed with the peas.

*Asparagus Polonnaise

Use fresh or quick-frozen asparagus tips and cook in a small amount of boiling, salted water until tensprinkling of der. In the meantime, melt butter in skillet, and brown fine dry bread crumbs in it. Toss this mixture into the asparagus just before serving. *Tossed Spring Salad

(Serves 6)

1/2 head lettuce Few leaves of leaf lettuce

1 medium-sized cucumber 1/2 cup sliced radishes

1 green pepper .

Salt and pepper 2 tablespoons blue cheese, crumbled

French dressing Break head lettuce into bite-sized

pieces. Arrange on leaves of lettuce. Add cucumber, peeled and sliced with radishes and green pepper which has been slivered. Sprinkle with salt and freshly ground pepper, then cheese. Add

French dressing and toss lightly. French Dressing (Makes 1 cup)

34 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon sugar

1/4 teaspoon paprika 1/4 teaspoon dry mustard

14 cup vinegar cup salad oil

1 teaspoon minced parsley 1 clove garlie, cut

Combine all ingredients in a botle; cover and shake. Chill and use as needed.

Plums for the ice cream dessert may be chilled in advance, though it's not necessary to remove them from cans or jars until almost serving time.

*Ice Cream with Green Gage Plums (Serves 6)

1 quart vanilla ice cream 1 No. 21/2 size can green gage plums

Drain syrup from plums. Arrange ice cream in a large bowl with large spoon or scoop. Garnish or surround with the drained plums. Serve immediately with a pitcher of the syrup, drained from the plums.







How Sin Begins

Lesson for April 8, 1951

NO ONE can believe in sin who does not believe in God. That is, no one can believe that sin is real unless he believes that God is real. For the meaning of sin is re-

ligious; it cannot be understood at all, apart from God. For sin means going contrary to the will of God. Sin may not consist of "doing" anything, of course; it may be only wishing or thinking agairst God; or it may be Dr. Foreman

refusing to do, or neglecting to do,

what God wants done. A thing is not right just because God wills it; he could not, by a mere proclamation, make murder good and mother-love wicked. But God never wills a thing unless it is right, or forbids it unless it is wrong; one reason for this is that he is creator of all, and so knows what is best for every creature.

Sin on the Outside

HOW does sin begin? The Bible says sin has been on this earth as long as people have lived there. But the story of the temptation in the Garden of Eden is also a parable of how sin always

Now we can see in this story that sin came into the world because there came a suggestion from the outside. Not everything in this universe is now good; there is anti-God at work, as well as pro-God. There are forces at work that do not wish God's plans to succeed.

If this seems hard to take, at least it cannot be denied that a great many sins would never have been committed without some pull from the outside. A child who goes to school for the first time will pick up, in a few days, habits and language and attitudes that shock the parents. They wonder what's got into the child. Her playmates' meanness has got into her, that's the nub of it.

Sin on the Inside

BUT the fact is, we can't blame the situation as if the situation were the sinner.

If it were simply the situation that makes the sin, then every bank clerk would be as dishonest as the worst, and every man who passes a bar would not pass it but go inside and get drunk just like the bums who

can't pass a bar-room door. No, there is something on the inside of us that pushes toward sin. What is it? The story in Genesis may offer a good clue. One of the New Testament writers put it this way: "A man's temptation is due to the pull of his own inward desires, which can be enormously attractive." (James 1:14, J. B. Phillips translation.)

Sin Beforehand

THERE is another sad feature of sin that stands out in the Genesis story and in the story of Everyman. That is, sin almost never looks the same afterwards as it did before.

Before the sin, Eve sees the forbidden fruit as beautiful and desirable; afterwards in shame she hides away from God. Living with herself, with her husband, with God, is no longer the pleasure it had been.

In the last stages of sin, to be sure, it may be quite different; a man may be caught in the grip of a habit he hates, and no one can call him worse names than he calls himself. But in the beginnings of sin, few if any persons see anything repulsive or bad in what they are about

That is why "I do as I please" is a fatally bad rule for living. If you do as you please, sooner or later you will please wrong, and down you will go. Adam and Eve did exactly as they pleased, and lost their Paradise.
