John Sharp to begin high-quality, low-cost service for Texans

To Cugansthe grainorbasiness asusuar State Comptroller John Sharp has announced save taxpayers an estimated $\$ 4.5$ billion during the next two years.
"Our purpose is to porde with a full range is provide the Legislature without crippling vital services, and to operate state government more efficiently and effectively," Sharp said.
"At a time when every issue has become a pocketbook issue, we need to cut against the grain of business as usual in our state government and start providing high-quality, low-cost customer ser afford," he said.
The 460 proposals released in a report titled "Against the Grain" are the latest recommenda-
tions from the comptroller's "Texas Performance Review" report.
The two-volume report, which covers 192
areas of state government, details the comptroller's recommendations to save tax dollars and to streamline state government opera-
tions. "It is a combination of one-time cost savings and long range proposals designed to help the state government through is budge crises," said KellyF
office.
"The bulk of the proposals are designed to reinvent state government to prevent future budget crises," Fero said.
Fero said the proposals, which must be approved by the Legislature, also are gearedtoward improving customer service for the state's tax-
payers.
Among Sharp's recommendations are proposals to increase child support collections to almost 100 percent by the year 2000 , to improve
prison operations and to make a highly trained work force available to Texas businesses.

Lubbock civic center to see name in lights

| The Lubbock City Council will decide at a meeting Thursday where to install a proposed $\$ 100,000$ electronic marquee that will display Lubbock Memorial Civic Center's upcoming events. <br> The double-sided message center will display two rows of 12 -inch tall letters and will be about 20 feet long and 4 feet 6 inches tall. <br> The city council will consider the placement of the proposed electronic marquee on a parcel of land, between Avenue Q and the fountain on Eighth Street, that is a dedicated public right-of-way. <br> The land is not subject to the city's zoning ordinance because it is a public right-of-way and is in an urban renewal area, city zoning specialist Jerrel Northcutt said. <br> The electronic message center will be the first of six civic center improvement projects. The other five projects are estimated to cost the city $\$ 100,000$. <br> An expansion project will be considered after the $\$ 200,000$ improvements are completed. |

What was supposed to be a celebration turned ugly for about 400,000 Cowboys fans Tuesday after a riot broke out leaving at least 24 people
injured and stores and vendors looted. The Dallas manager of special events, Andrew Robinson, said Tuesday's violent celebration was the city's own version of Mardi Gras.,
"There was just too much emotion. Too much love for the Cowboys," The Dallas Morning News reported Robinson as saying Funny, when does loving someone or something mean it's OK to smash beer bottles in people's faces or repeatedly kick them while they lie on the ground from the first blow? Quite an expression of love.
Robinson's attempt to gloss over the city's lack of planning Robinson's attempt to gloss over the city's lack of planning is
infuriating. What is even more aggravating is the fact that the city did fail infuriating. What is even more aggravating is the fact that the city did
to adequately plan for an event in which violence was a potential. In this era of no values, the concern for safety should always foremost in our leaders' minds. Instead the Dallas city officials chose to ignore that our society is one of drive-by shootings, gangs and drug dealers positioned on virtually every stret corner.
Dallas officials apparently thought 350 police officers patrolling the downtown area and 110 additional officers on call were more than enough to keep the crowd under control. Last year, more than 500 police officer ensured peace during the city's annual rexas-OU party,
