Open House Is Planned For Nov. 15

The new E. L. Graham Memorial Hospital became the property of the Cisco Housing Authority last week and the process of moving equipment into the magnificent community medical center

Plans are to show the new facility to the public in a formal open house on November 14, and thereafter to open it for patients on November 23, Lloyd McGrew, president of the Authority said.

The contractor, Herman Bennett Construction Company, Brownwood, handed the key to the hospital to Mr. McGrew Monday of last week after the Authority, responding to a recommendation of the architect, Parker-Croston Associates of Fort Worth accepted the 30-bed facility.

Acceptance followed almost a week of inspections by representatives of the Authority, the architects, the State Department of Health, the HEW and other agencies, federal and state, involved in the financing and construction of the property.

The architect certified that practically all details of the "punch list" which sets out minor details of construction reflects, had been satisfactorily attended to and recommended acceptance of the building. The recommenda-

Senior Citizens To Have Bazaar

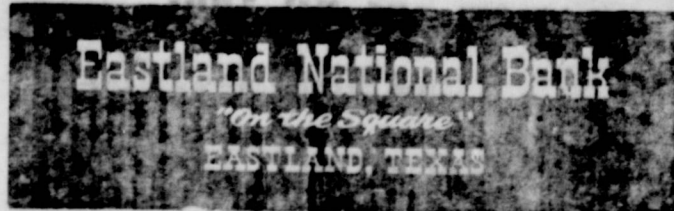

(Continued from Page One) poison acts quickly and can kill an animal within a very short time after the damage plant is eaten. Whether a poisoned animal can be saved usually depends upon how soon a veterinarian can get to it.

Frosted Johnsongrass or sorghum should not be grazed until the damaged plants are as dry as good quality hay of for at least a week after the frost. If the crop was ready to cut for hay before the frost, it may be cut immediately provided adequate curing time is allowed. Silage made from frosted plants is safe as soon as the ensiling process is complete.

Young plants or second growth suckers are more likely to cause trouble than older plants nearing maturity. Too, the more luxuriant the growth, the more likely the plants will be dangerous if their growth is interrupted.

Additional information is available from local veterinarians and county agents relating to grazing and/or harvesting and storing of frost wilted plants.

It Has Been

During the summer of 1887 the founder of forty two was in Mineral Wells, Texas, while his dad sold peaches on the street. Young Thompson visited domino games in hotel lobbies, under shade trees and on front porches. People played dominoes in public places because cards were against the law. He introduced the new game of Forty-Two and gamblers welcomed it with much enthusiasm.

Drummers learned to play the game while in Mineral Wells and liked it. They taught others as they made different towns on their routes and the game spread like wild fire over the country.

"Forty-Two" said Mr. Thompson, "is just a good relaxing game. Women and men can play together without fussing. So it's sociable."

Rising Star was buzzing with plans for the Free Fall Fair in September 1940.

A motorcade made trips to nearby towns to "Tell about the Fair." Stops were made at Pioneer, Cross Plains, Williams, May Sidney, DeLeon, Gorman, Carbon, Eastland and Cisco.

Entertainment was furnished by the drum corps of the Rising Star High School pep squad, a trio composed of Estelline and Catherine Valliant and Mary Nell Barnes, and by a hillbilly band.

Noise on the trip was amplified through the Wilcox Hardware public address system and Waldo Wilcox acted as master of ceremonies at each stop.

The late W. H. (Bill) Harrington was in charge of the motorcade. Large crowds were present in each town visited to welcome the Rising Star group.

Recently the question has arisen as to how the game "forty-two" originated. After an extensive search the following story was found:

The story goes that "Texas is the birth place of Forty-Two, a game played with dominoes.

W. A. Thompson a collector of United States revenue at Dallas developed the game in 1837.

Staunch moralists of the Victorian era called a deck of cards "the devil's picture gallery." They raised a warning finger at playing cards at home, on trains, in hotels, court houses, in restaurants and other public places.

Bridge and airplanes for transportation were unheard of when Mr. Thompson was ten years old. He and a school mate found a deck of cards and hid them away in the hay-loft and at guarded moments they learned the mysteries of 500 and seven-up.

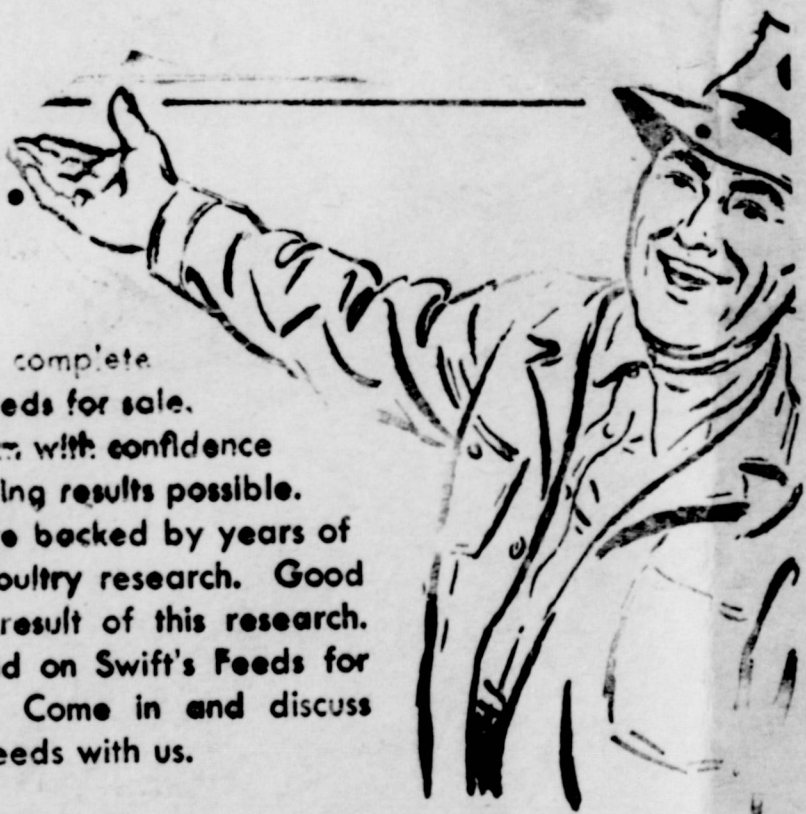
