Editorial
The Jewish Problem
All those who lived through the Hitler era sympathize
with the world's Jews, and the monstrous atrocities to which so many were subjected
That, however, doesn't solve today's problems. The United States (through the United Nations) hoped to solve and crux of the problem by the creation of the state of Israel Middle East at the end of World War II, displacing many Arabs in the process. ecourse, historically Jews had a claim on the land; but one corld's borders many times. So whether this was the answer remains to be seen. Certainly the troubles of recent years in the area, and Israel's expans ion, create doubts,
No problem involving only a few million people No problem involving only a few million people so domi-
nates world and American politics today, and Jewish demnates world and American politics today, and Jewish dem-
onstrators and agitators are often militant (though not as ruthless as Arab guerrillas).
Critics point to the fact that U.S. relations with Russia may hang in the balance because of arguments over the may hang in which the Russians allow Russian Jews to emigrate to Israel. What other group of foreign nationals so dominate U.S. policy? What other foreign citizens group do
we consider to be the business of the U.S. Congress? Critics also point to the growing chance that this country
will be dragged into a war against the Arai states, not bewill be dragged into a war against the Araib states, not be-
cause the American people favor such a policy, but because cause the American people favor such a policy, but because
of the tremendous political influence of Jews on both U.S. parties. Thus U.S. politicians, including Presidents, are always acting to placate American Jewish organizations
and contributors. The Arabs have almost no political clout and contributors. The Arabs have almost no political clout
${ }^{2}$ in Washington. No one can predict the outcome of the dilemma. But it
can be confidently said that there is too much stress on racism and militancy in Jewish (and Arab) circles today

Agnew Reflections
The current preoccupation with the new Vice President
dominates the news but the Spiro Agnew case is still of historical interest to the nation. Agnew was chosen at the last minute in 1968 as a com-
promise candidate acceptable to both extremes. Thus not
much consideration or investigation had been centered on much
him.

sibly more severe punishment. It's best for the nation, for many reasons, that its Vice President was fined and not
