## ATLANTA (AP) - With EmmittSmith, the Dallas Cowboys didn't

 lose. When they lost him Sunday, they didn't win.A bruised right quadricep ended Smith's afternoon two minutes before halftime, and the Atlanta Falcons stopped the Cowboys' sevengame winning streak $27-14$

of the Falcons' best defenders, also contributed on offense by catching a 70 -yard touchdown pass and high-stepping to the end zone with $3: 51$
left.
Even before Smith was injured, he did little. The Falcons limited him to only 1 yard on one carry and 9 yards on four catches The defending Super Bowl champion Cowboys ( $7-3$ ) had been unbeaten since Smith came back from a two-game salary holdout to start the season.
