Non-profit organization studies French abortion pill

| NEW YORK (AP) - Fearful of violence, a research organization is conducting the first nationwide study of the French abortion pill RU-486 without saying where the work is being done or how many clinics are participating. <br> 'You may have noticed there are some nuts out there who do bad things to people who deliver abortions," said Dr. C. Wayne Bardin, research director at the Population Council, the nonprofit group sponsoring the study More than 100 women have been given the pill since September as part of the $\$ 8$ million study, which could make the drug routinely available in the United States by 1996, Bardin said. <br> The availability of RU-486, now called mifepristone, will not be advertised, Bardin said Thursday at a news conference. Women coming to clinics for surgical abortions will be quietly option, he said. | Guards were posted at the entrance to the news conference in a New York hotel. Reporters were asked to show identification before being admitted. <br> The study is aimed at determining the safety and effectiveness of RU486. When it is completed in the spring of 1995, an application for approval of the abortion pill be submitted to the Food and Drug Administration, which has promised to expedite its review, Bardin said. <br> 'It is a tragedy that pro-abortion advocates want to use women as guinea pigs," Wanda Franz, president of the National Right to Life Committee, said in a statement. "NRLC opposes testing of RU-486 for abortion both because it kills unborn children and because its long-term side effects for women are unknown. <br> Bardin said more than 12 and fewer than 20 clinics are involved in the study. It will include 2,100 women over 18 who are in the first two months |
