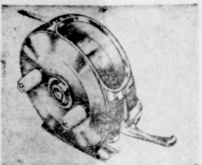


What Fly Reel?

Naturally, there will never be any satisfactory end to the controversy among fly rod addicts on the relative advantages of the single action or automatic fly reels—or which type is best to use. Supporters of each type are legion and it would be difficult to change the mind of a user of either type about the superior qualities or conveniences of the other type.

There is much to be said, of course, concerning the merits of both kinds of reels. The fly rod man who swears by the single action reel has his reasons. Among these are the fact that it permits more discretionary retrieve of the line and its manipulation; there is no danger of an inadvertent flick of the reel lever causing the breaking off of a delicate rod tip, and the single-action reel presupposes more complete control of the situation in the actual playing and landing of a fish.

On the other hand, devotees of the automatic reel will indignantly shout that the angler who can't

keep his finger off the reel lever when it doesn't belong there, hasn't any business fishing at all. Too, there is no inherent over choice of reels when the question of convenience of retrieve is concerned. The automatic reel saves many fine lines each fishing season by permitting excess line to be rapidly spooled in the reel and always out of the way and never underfoot. The automatic fly reel user has the advantage when fish are rising rapidly, but at long distances from the angler, and he must get line in and back to the scene of action as rapidly as possible if he would get as many fish as possible.

The happy choice, of course, would be a combination affair—a reel which would be both single action and automatic, the function being at the will of the angler. It is surprising that no such reel was forthcoming for so long, but to the satisfaction of both the single-action reel addict and the automatic reel user, the advantages of both types of reels are now available in one precision instrument.

Ocean City's "90" is the new combination fly reel—the first to hit the U.S. market. This new automatic, which permits manual retrieve by means of a two-handled spool, and also may be operated manually by the conventional trip lever, is an upright model, with aluminum frame and spool, and a highly-polished chrome line guide. Here one package is a reel that takes care of the needs and desires of both the single-action reel user and the automatic type fancier. The reel is reasonably priced and its performance is such that it is certain to find a place in the gear of nearly every fly-rod user.

New Game Birds

Game bird fanciers and biologists over the land had something new to think about following the announcements by the Fish and Wildlife Service that two new game birds are being introduced, experimentally, to America—the European black grouse and the capercaillie. These are hardy grouse species that thrive in a Scandinavian climate similar to that of our northern states. They make good shooting—and they're good eating. And speaking of good eating, the jet black capercaillie male weighs 12 to 15 pounds. Besides, he's a wary and a fast flier, qualities that would make him a popular game bird if he does well in his New World environment. The black grouse is a smaller woods and moorland species, weighing three to five pounds.

BIBLICAL READING: Jeremiah 14: 1-2

Nation Going Soft
Lesson for April 23, 1950

AFTER the fraternity dance one of the "brothers" shot another, for no good reason. Well, there was a reason of a sort. The killer was drunk, on liquor the fraternity had bought and served.

Every day the papers carry reports of cars that "went out of control" with serious or fatal results. Careful reading of the story too often brings out the fact that the boys had been visiting a night-spot or two before the crash. Survivors will tell the police they couldn't have been drunk, they had only had a few beers. Well, you don't have to be drunk to let a car get out from your control.

Gets Monotonous, Doesn't It?
A SEX CRIME is committed by a middle-aged man who sheds tears over it afterward and can hardly remember anything about it.

Nobody was drunk—they had only been taking a few drinks . . .
A 27-year-old woman was shot and killed during an argument with her sister-in-law.

The shooting, it was claimed, was accidental. They had been having some friendly beers in a near-by tavern . . .
After they got home, there was an argument. One woman got her husband's revolver out to scare the other woman, and the first thing she knew, she was being arrested for murder. Her husband told the police that when sober his wife was "deathly scared" of guns.

The Truth About Liquor
WELL . . . this could be strung out to the length of several columns, without half trying. The above items are not from some chamber of horrors conducted by the W.C.T.U., nor from a sermon by some Anti-Saloon league preacher, but gathered from newspaper items from a few days' papers in a city which certainly is not prejudiced against liquor.

The truth about liquor can never be learned from the advertising pages, it can be better learned from the news columns.
Better yet, if you want to know the truth about it, ask the lawyers, doctors and ministers you know. Ask the lawyers if their business would be brisker or slower if liquor were not in existence.

Ask the doctors whether steady drinkers are stronger or weaker, resistance to disease. Ask the ministers if they know of any troubles in their congregations due to liquor.
(And if even church people have troubles with it, what about people with no religion?)

Drink and Doom
IT IS NOT TRUE that if liquor were totally abolished from the earth, all the troubles of mankind would vanish. Man has too much meanness in him. A sober scoundrel is one of the worst.

Remember that in Amos' time there was no whiskey, no brandy, no distilled liquors, only "mild" stuff like wine. Every denunciation of drink in the Bible is directed against what would now be called light wine and beers.

One thing is as certain now as it was in Amos' time: A nation that insists on having its liquor is not the nation God will insist on saving when its day of doom arrives.

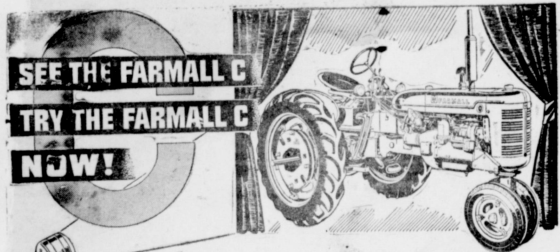
