





# Students find niche, unity at Tech

The unique priorities that bind non-traditional students often are what separate them from the rest of the students on campus.

"Incoming, non-traditional students are not alone," said Kathleen Griffith, interim president of Texas Tech's Non-Traditional Students Association and a junior English-technical communications major from Lubbock. "Get connected."

Last year 5,000 non-traditional students enrolled at Tech, Griffith said.

A non-traditional student is anyone who is a transfer student, a student who works, a student with children, a married student or a student between 25 and 55, she said.

"We are here to provide a means for students to get connected and to address the needs of non-traditional students," she said.

Non-traditional students have many unique priorities, such as the need for child care, affordable housing and required courses offered after 5 p.m., Griffith said.

Mike Dunlap was one of the students who initiated the Non-Traditional Students Association.

It was started in fall 1994 when a

small group of non-traditional students got together and decided they needed more representation. said Mike Dunlap, a sophomore management information systems major from Wolforth.

The organization officially formed in spring 1995, Dunlap said.

"For the most part, we're married, divorced, have kids, live off campus and work," he said.

"We have different needs than the traditional student."

According to a 1995 report by U.S. Department of Education, non-traditional student enrollment has increased more than 40 percent since the 1960s.

At Tech, about 20 percent of students fit into this category, he said.

"The demand for education gets greater as time goes on," Dunlap said.

"After kids are grown, parents want a degree and a job. There is a larger number of baby boomers coming back to college. Don't give up, keep pushing to get that degree."

Non-traditional students often complain about the need for more representation on campus, Griffith said.

Of about 240 students involved in the Student Association, Tech's student body government, none qualify as non-traditional students, said Student Association President Geoff Wayne.

A problem with non-traditional students is in many cases they do not have the time to get involved, Wayne said.

"They have a different set of issues than the average student, such as time constraints and family on top of school," he said. "My goal is to work to get information out to let students know what is available for every student."

Jana Morrison, a non-traditional student and a senior English/history major from Midland, said she did not know Tech had a non-traditional student association.

"Before I came to Tech, I was afraid I wouldn't fit in on campus," Morrison said.

But the younger student body that intimidated Morrison now encourages her, she said.

When she graduates, Morrison said she plans to teach high school.

The ability to get along with younger students gives her confidence that she will be a good teacher, she said.

One concern Morrison has about being a non-traditional student is that she has to worry about the additional costs of putting four children through college.

"Recently, we all got computers, and now my kids fax me their papers to look over," she said.

# Bryan Novoa returns to Tech with eyes on PGA Tour

Bryan Novoa will miss the first week of classes at Texas Tech. It is not because the senior is sleeping. It is just that he is preparing for what he hopes will be his future.

Novoa, a three-time All-Southwest Conference performer at Tech, exhausted his eligibility following last season's successful campaign. After leading his team to the final SWC men's golf championship and capturing third team All-America status, Novoa is back in Lubbock to wrap up his degree in restaurant hotel and institutional management. He expects to graduate in December.

This week, he is participating in the Texas State Open in Houston. Upon his return to Lubbock on Friday, Novoa will begin his duties as a graduate assistant to men's golf coach Tommy Wilson, a non-paying job.

"I'm looking forward to him coming back and getting his degree and also helping me out," Wilson said.

Novoa has had a whirlwind summer. Last week, he participated in the 96th U.S. Amateur Championship, played at Pumpkin Creek Golf Course in Cornelius, Ore. In a tournament crowded with big names and famous bloodlines, Novoa represented himself well, finishing eighth in a field of talented golfers.

Tiger Woods, who recently turned professional, won the event for a record third consecutive time and appeared to be well on his way to a lucrative future in golf. Woods never had to face Novoa on his way to the title, a fact that Novoa regrets.

"I really wanted a shot at Tiger," he said. "I knew I could play with the

Novoa's finish can be attributed to gradual improvement seen every year Upon graduating from Nixon High

in Laredo, he decided to attend the University of Texas at San Antonio. He played a year at UTSA, garnering All-Southland Conference honors his freshman year.

In spring 1994, he transferred to Tech and began making an impact. He played three years at Tech, and last spring was the top scorer for a team that captured the final SWC crown.

"He was one of the best golfers we have ever had here at Tech," Wilson said. "He played consistently and well every time he went out there, and he never failed to improve from event to event."

Novoa received a scholarship over the summer in order to help him finish his studies.

After graduation, Novoa hopes to eventually earn a PGA Tour card, a feat that may be best accomplished by qualifying first for the Nike Tour or playing overseas. After getting a taste of the spotlight, he knows what it will take to get back.

"You play good golf with guts, not the best stroke," Novoa said. "That was my first time ever on national television. I learned a lot from it, and I have to experience that again."

This semester, he plans to play in several pro-ams between helping out Wilson and completing school. Novoa knows that if he eventually finds success as a professional, he will owe it partly to his experiences at Tech.

"The tough conditions you have to play in at Lubbock, it prepares you for anything," he said. "If anything, Tech helped me...create a never-say-die type of attitude."

Novoa will leave Tech in December, taking with him a conference

championship ring and several individual accolades.

Wilson said Novoa will find success as a professional golfer.

"To reach the next level of proficiency on the tour, you have to be pa-

tient, No. 1," Wilson said. "During that four hours on the course, it's total concentration. He's not quite there yet, but he will get there."

For Novoa, that experience can't come soon enough.

## Cowboys expects Smith to play, Bears lose Salaam

IRVING (AP) — His big grin says everything. Emmitt Smith believes he'll be on the playing field Monday night when the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys open against the Chicago Bears.

"I feel very good about my chances Monday night," Smith said on Wednesday. "I'll know for sure in the next couple of days, but I believe I will be able to play. I think they are going to give me the ball as long as I can stand up."

Since Smith suffered a strained left knee ligament Aug. 17 in the second quarter of a preseason game against Denver, Cowboys coaches have hoped he would rebound like he always does from injury.

"He's a tough son-of-a-gun," running backs coach Joe Brodsky said. "We always expect him to

heal fast. But you always wonder if this is the one time he won't be able to play."

Smith said Bears coach Dave Wannstedt, a former Cowboys assistant, is probably planning his entire defense around stopping Smith.

"I expect ol' Dave will have that line of scrimmage crowded trying to stop me," Smith said.

Chicago Bears running back Rashaan Salaam will miss this season's opener because of a hamstring injury.

"He's wanting to play. But he's still got a little bit of swelling," coach Dave Wannstedt said after Salaam could only jog through Wednesday's practice. "He'd play if it was up to him, but that wouldn't be the best thing for the team. We have to be realistic."

## Red Raiders show up swinging in Big 12

The Texas Tech women's golf team is not often heard about on campus, but the Big 12 knows all about the threat it brings on the golf course.

Tech's women's golf team finished the final season of the Southwest Conference ranked No. 2. Tech continued the success by being ranked No. 14 in the final national polls, making it four years in a row that Tech has been in the nation's top 30.

"If we were in the Big 12 last year, we would have been ranked No. 2," Tech coach Jeff Mitchell said.

The Big 12 consists of five schools that are continually ranked in the top 20. Texas was ranked No. 1 last year.

Senior Tamara Parker said if the team plays up to its ability, it will be a

real contender against Texas.

"Texas is going to be tough again this year," she said. "But we are going to be right up there with them."

Parker has not missed an event yet at Tech, and Mitchell said her consistency in playing will help the team succeed in the Big 12.

The loss of J. J. Rorie and Tracy Thomson, two strong players and leaders, will be felt tremendously, Mitchell said.

Mitchell hopes Parker and sophomore Brooke Lowrance will rise to the occasion and take over the position as leaders on the team.

Lowrance placed high in tournament standards, winning the Texas Women's Amateur this summer.

Mitchell said the win would raise her confidence level.

"Last year she was a strong contender for All-Conference and came really close," Mitchell said.

The Red Raiders also will receive some help from Julie McMahon, a sophomore transfer from Arkansas. McMahon played in the No. 1 spot as a Razorback.

"Julie will help fill the spot left by J. J. and Tracy," he said.

Junior Kristen Knight will provide experience behind Parker, and it is important for her to come in and utilize her skills, he said.

Freshman Heather Wrede comes to

Tech with the most experience in her background.

She won the 1995 Illinois Amateur Championship, and Mitchell said she will bring strong potential for the team now and in the future.

Senior Robyn Phillips did not play in any tournaments last year but will start to participate in tournaments this year.

"If she plays in the top five then that is the key to the game because she has the ability to be a big player," Mitchell said.

Parker said the dreams are high for the team.

"The ranking of the team last year really lit a spark for the whole team," Parker said. "I think that being in the top 10 is a reachable goal."

## Rockets answer Barkley-trade critics by acquiring Jones, Mack, Moore

HOUSTON (AP) — The Houston Rockets on Wednesday signed center Charles Jones and guards Sam Mack and Tracy Moore to contracts. Terms were not disclosed.

Mack played with five CBA teams and the San Antonio Spurs before landing with the Rockets last year. He played 31 games, averaging 10.8 points and 3.2 rebounds.

Moore averaged 11.4 points in eight games last season.

He spent eight seasons with the CBA as well as the Dallas Mavericks and Detroit Pistons.

Jones begins his 14th NBA season and third with the Rockets as a backup center.

He averaged about seven minutes in 46 games last season.

## R.P. Fuller Track Stadium renovations complete

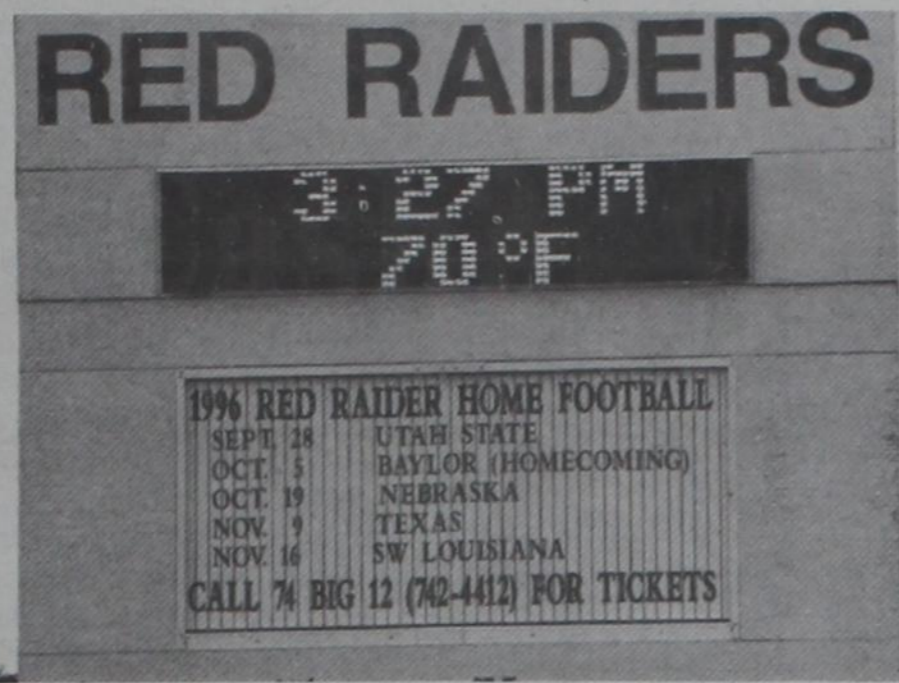

As the Texas Tech women's soccer team prepares to play its first season in the Big 12, \$600,000 worth of renovations make R. P. Fuller Track Stadium seem more like home.

"Our track had that infield and we went to widen it to accommodate soccer," said Tech's interim athletic director Gerald Myers. "It was barely the minimum for soccer, so we pushed the east side back and rearranged the track."

While the infield was widened and the track resurfaced, some of the various track and field apparatus were moved as well.

"The track was more than 20 years old and it just had to be resurfaced," Myers said.

Along with the renovations by the school, a \$300,000 automatic electronic scoreboard was installed at the track and paid for by advertisements

from local businesses, he said.

The renovations were funded by the athletic department fund for repairs and renovations, he said.

"It was something that just had to be done," Myers said. "The track was

20 years old and it was time. One of our needs and goals as we entered the Big 12 was to expand our facilities."

Tech women's soccer coach Diane Nichols said she and her players were impressed by the renovations.

"I think it's going to be great," Nichols said.

In soccer, there is no exact playing field specifications, but with the expansion, the field will fall within the minimum and maximum range, she said. When the east side of the infield was pushed back, the dimensions changed from 108 yards by 53 yards to 110 yards by 65 yards, she said.

Not only will the renovations benefit this year's team, but it will help recruiting new soccer players across the country, she said.

"Anytime facilities are nice it helps recruiting because players like to play where there are nice facilities," Nichols said.

## Two Missouri players suspended

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP)—Two Missouri players have been suspended for Saturday's season opener at Texas after their arrests on theft charges, Coach Larry Smith said.

Sophomore defensive back Randy Potter and junior nose tackle Donnell Jones were arrested Monday night for allegedly shoplifting clothing worth \$191 from the J.C. Penney store at the Columbia Mall, police Capt. Randy Boehm said.

Jones also was found to have an outstanding warrant issued in March for passing bad checks.

The two were allegedly seen putting items in a sports bag Jones was carrying.

When security officers stopped the two on their way out of the store, they found three sports jerseys and seven packs of athletic



socks in the bag, Boehm said.

# Tech assistant ready to give program a boost

For the newest Texas Tech assistant women's soccer coach, the community spirit of soccer while growing up in the Northern Virginia area brought her to the sport.

"I did gymnastics growing up and that was really individual and high pressure," Cathy Reid said. "Soccer is a real community sport. It's a real good way to get involved and meet people."

Even though she did not start the sport until the seventh grade, Reid became an All-American while playing for James Madison in 1992.

Reid said she wanted to bring some of her memories of her playing days with her to Tech.

"Growing up I played with a youth select team, and we got to travel a lot," she said. "With these girls being in West Texas, we get to travel a lot, and there's a lot of team bonding."

Reid said she preferred to coach at the youth and developmental levels but was drawn to the coaching position at Tech.

"What drew me to Tech really is that I wanted to get back into school," she said. "I've been out in the working world for a couple of years, but then I decided all of the sudden I wanted to get back into this."

As a coach, Reid said she wanted

to be fair but also do what is good for the team as a whole.

"I love the players that work hard, have a good attitude about what they are doing and give 100 percent in practice," she said.

Reid said she would like to see the third-year Tech program become more competitive.

"From my experience, playing on a pretty high level of soccer from where I come from, hopefully we can get them up to level to be competitive," she said.

"Everybody wants national recognition, but my goal is to get this soccer team where I know I can get them to be."

Even with her coaching stint at Tech beginning, Reid said a college head coaching position is not her goal.

"I just want to share any experience I had at this level and help build this program as much as I can while I'm here," Reid said.

Tech women's soccer coach Diane Nichols said Reid will be an asset to the program because she has been around soccer most of her life.

"She has great knowledge of the game and she will be a great recruiter because she has a great eye for talent," Nichols said.

"She knows how to be in a top-20 soccer program."

# 49ers Rice signs for \$32 million

SANTA CLARA, Calif. (AP) — Jerry Rice, the NFL's career leader in touchdowns, receptions and receiving yardage, now has security, peace of mind and a hefty contract to go with the lofty numbers he's put up on the field.

The seven-year pact, worth \$32 million, runs through 2002 and replaces a contract due to expire following the 1997 season.

The deal included a \$4 million signing bonus as well as reporting and roster bonuses worth nearly \$10 million.

Base salaries over the life of the contract are worth about \$18 million.

However, the contract is not guaranteed, meaning Rice would have to play it out over the seven years to collect all the money.

Rice, who turns 34 in October, would be 41 in the final year of the deal and he said he's kept himself in good enough shape to fulfill the terms of the pact.

"At 41, I think I'll still feel just like I'm 25," he said.

"My goal is to finish this contract. I've been very fortunate over the years. I'm in great shape. I look forward to the challenge. I don't

think my play is going to decrease. If anything, I think it's going to get better."

Rice is coming off a record-breaking season in which he caught 122 passes for an NFL-record 1,848 yards.

He enters 1996 with career records for most touchdowns (156), most TD receptions (146) most receiving yards (15,123) and most past receptions (942) and most 100-yard receiving games (58) among others.

Coming to terms on the new deal frees him to concentrate on football, added Rice.

"I don't have to worry about my contract any more. That's behind me," Rice said during a news conference Wednesday.

"This is the position I wanted to be in a long time ago. Now it's just football."

Club president Carmen Policy said the contract was designed to keep Rice in a 49ers uniform for the rest of his career. San Francisco has seen such superstars as Joe Montana and Ronnie Lott finish their careers elsewhere.

Policy said the organization didn't want to see that happen with
